INTRODUCTION

People study the Bible for various reasons and to different depths. The motive for the study may be intellectual or spiritual or both, and this influences to what use the knowledge is put. Numerous interpretations of Bible passages, associations between the various passages or books within “the book” and between the two major divisions, the Old and the New Testament have influenced the almost uncountable publications and unpublished writings already in existence about the Bible.

This quiz book aims at helping individuals determine how much of the information in the Bible they know and rather than dwell on interpretations, focuses on facts as they are recorded. It helps to stimulate discussions which will, no doubt, influence the lives of those who are genuinely studying for the purpose of doing the will of God.

There are some questions on associations between passages and books as well as between the peoples of the Bible where these are relevant. Most of the questions are simple enough for younger age groups while there are some which are based on in-depth study of the Bible. Everyone who is able to read will find questions that are at the right level for his or her age.

HOW TO USE THE QUIZ BOOK

The book starts with general questions about the Bible and then goes book by book from Genesis to Malachi. The questions are mixed, sometimes graduating from simple ones

into those based on previous in-depth study of the Bible. Users may start from any section of the quiz or go systematically from one book to the next.

The questions may be used for competitions between groups or for games like “passing the basket” where questions are written on pieces of paper, folded and mixed inside a basket or any other container. Music is played or the group sings choruses and the basket is passed from hand to hand. The person holding the basket when the music or chorus is stopped picks one question and answers it.

Answers to all questions are provided at the back of the quiz book.

- 2.65 Pharaoh went after the Israelites with --- of his best chariots and --- other chariots of Egypt with officers in them.
- 2.66 The Israelites were --- as they encamped by the --- and saw the Egyptians marching after them

- 2.67 As Pharaoh approached, the Israelites complained and claimed that it would have been better for them to ---- than to die in the ---
- 2.68 In order to part the sea, God instructed Moses to --- his staff and --- his --- over the sea
- 2.69 The --- of God and the --- of cloud moved behind the Israelites to separate them from the Egyptians
- 2.70 God blew back the water of the sea all --- with a strong --- ---
- 2.71 The --- passed through the sea on ---- ---- while --- and --- --- drowned and laid dead on the shore
- 2.72 --- led the Israelites through the --- sea
- 2.73 --- and --- sang a song on how --- threw the horses and the --- into the sea
- 2.74 --- was afraid of Moses' radiant face
- 2.75 --- was a prophetess who played the timbrel (tambourine)
- 2.76 When the Israelites had traveled – days without water, they got to --- whose water was bitter
- 2.77 The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and --- in the Dessert of --- which was between Elim and Mount Sinai
- 2.78 The Israelites were instructed to gather --- (enough food) for only --- in the dessert
- 2.79 The only day the Israelites could collect manna for 2 days was ---
- 2.80 God gave the Israelites --- to eat in the evening
- 2.81 Manna kept till the next day by --- Israelites developed ---
- 2.82 The --- day was set aside as a day of rest, a ---- ---- to the Lord
- 2.83 --- was the name --- gave the bread from heaven
- 2.84 The Israelites ate manna for --- years
- 2.85 --- and --- are the names Moses called the place where water came out of the rock when he --- it with ---
- 2.86 --- and --- helped the Israelites to win a war by ----
- 2.87 Lifting of “The Glory of the Lord” which covered the ---- as a cloud determined when the Israelites moved from a camping site
- 2.88 Aaron, the first --- took earrings and made them into a --- for Israelites to worship
- 2.89 The sons of Moses were --- and ---
- 2.90 Moses named the son ---- because he said “I have become --- in a foreign land”
- 2.91 ---- is a name to remind Moses of the fact that the God of his father helped and saved him from the sword of ----
- 2.92 Delegation of duties as a management method was first described to Moses by ---
- 2.93 God said that even though the whole earth belongs to Him, the Israelites will be to Him a kingdom of --- and a --- nation
- 2.94 God descended on Mount --- as thunder, lightening, a --- and a very loud ---
- 2.95 Only --- could go near the mountain when God descended on it, other people or animals would --- if they did
- 2.96 God asked --- to go down the mountain and bring --- with him
- 2.97 The first commandment says ----
- 2.98 God will punish up to the --- generation of those who --- Him and show love to a --- generation of those who love Him
- 2.99 ---- built much of the Tabernacle and was assisted by ---

2.100 Whoever works on the Sabbath must be ----



3 *LEVITICUS*

- 3.1 A burnt offering is a voluntary act of worship for the ---- of sin for which a ---, or --- or young pigeon for the --- may be used
- 3.2 A grain offering is performed by pouring --- and --- on fine flour to the --- who burns a handful of it
- 3.3 A ---- offering can be any animal male or female without defect
- 3.4 A sin offering for the anointed priest is a young ----
- 3.5 A guilt offering for unintentional sin is a --- or the alternative value in ----
- 3.6 --- and his --- were ordained as priests
- 3.7 To consecrate Aaron, --- poured anointing oil on his ---
- 3.8 Two sons of Aaron who died on the same day were ----- and ----
- 3.9 Fire came from the presence of God and burned 2 priests because they offered ---
- 3.10 ---- was a father who was advised not to mourn the death of his sons
- 3.11 --- and --- were priests ordered not to drink wine on any fermented drink
- 3.12 The hoof of animals was one of the signs of -----
- 3.13 Purification for a woman after childbirth for a girl is --- that for a boy
- 3.14 Skin problems must be shown to ---
- 3.15 A person with an infectious skin disease must be pronounced ---
- 3.16 To prevent the spread of mildew, contaminated clothing or leather must be ---
- 3.17 As a rule, whoever touches a man who has ---, or his bed is unclean
- 3.18 A clay pot that an unclean man touches must be ----
- 3.19 Aaron, a priest could not enter the sanctuary without ----
- 3.20 God's punishment for an Israelite or alien living with him who eats blood is ---
- 3.21 Unlike in the time of people like Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, marriage between close relations is ----

- 3.22 Homosexuality is detestable and sexual relationship with an animal a ---
- 3.23 The 10 commandments and more laws can be found in ----
- 3.24 --- provide for the poor by not reaping corners of their fields
- 3.25 Aliens are provided for by not picking grapes which have ---
- 3.26 The Day of Atonement is the --- day of the --- month
- 3.27 Blasphemy is punishable by ---
- 3.28 For injuring a neighbour, the old law is ---- for ---, --- for--- and --- for ---
- 3.29 The Sabbath of rest for farmlands is the ---
- 3.30 The Year of Jubilee is the --- Sabbath Year of rest or ----th year
- 3.31 To provide for the Sabbath Year of Rest, the --- year will produce food enough for --- years
- 3.32 One of the rewards of obedience of god's laws is that five hundred people will be able to chase one thousand enemies and one hundred will chase ----
- 3.33 God promised the Israelites that He will be their --- and they will be his ---
- 3.34 Disobedience may lead to God's anger causing people to eat the --- of their own sons and daughters
- 3.35 No one may dedicate the first born of an animal to God because ----
- 3.36 If a man dedicates his house as holy to the Lord and wants to redeem it , he must add ---% of the value as determined by the priest
- 3.37 Nothing that a person owns and devotes to the Lord may be --- or redeemed
- 3.38 A tithe of everything from the land (grain or fruit) belongs to---
- 3.39 A tithe of herds is every ---th animal that passes under a shepherd's rod
- 3.40 To redeem a tithe a ---th of the value must be added



4 *NUMBERS*

- 4.1 The first instruction from God on the taking of a census was given to ---
- 4.2 For the census, counting was to be by clans and ----
- 4.3 Those to be counted in the first census included ---
- 4.4 The number of men aged 20 years or more who will --- was to be by divisions
- 4.5 The highest number of men to serve in the army came from the clan of ---
- 4.6 The clan of --- was set aside to assist the priests
- 4.7 The Kohathites, a branch of Levites aged --- to --- served in the Tent of Meeting
- 4.8 The work of the gershonite clan was to carry the --- of the tabernacle
- 4.9 The total number of men who worked in the tabernacle was ---
- 4.10 If a man suspects his wife of adultery, he is to present a grain offering for ---
- 4.11 No razor may be used on the head of a ---
- 4.12 A man or woman who wants to make a vow of separation to the Lord must not take wine or ---- drink or vinegar or ---, --- and ---
- 4.13 “The Lord bless you and keep you” is a --- blessing
- 4.14 At the dedication of the tabernacle, the first clan to bring gifts was that of ---
- 4.15 The people who could not celebrate the Passover in Desert of Sinai were ---
- 4.16 The bones of animals eaten for the Passover meal must not be ---
- 4.17 When the sound of silver trumpets is heard once, only --- go before Moses
- 4.18 Moses’ father-in-law, Jethro is also known as ----
- 4.19 Whenever the ark set out Moses said ----
- 4.20 Whenever the ark came to a rest, Moses said ---
- 4.21 Manna was cooked and made into --- by Israelites
- 4.22 ---- asked God in anger if he conceived all the Israelites
- 4.23 ---- thought his leadership was a punishment from God
- 4.24 ---- like Jonah wanted God to put him to death
- 4.25 God asked Moses to tell Israelite leaders that the people will eat --- until it came out of their nostrils
- 4.26 Two leaders, --- and --- who did not go out to the tent prophesied in the camp
- 4.27 --- was jealous of the two leaders who prophesied in the Israelite camp

- 4.28 Kibroth Hattaavah was the name given to the place where some Israelites were burned because they ---
- 4.29 --- and --- talked against Moses for marrying a Cushite wife
- 4.30 God reveals himself to prophets in ---- and ----
- 4.31 God revealed Himself to Moses face-to-face because Moses was ----
- 4.32 Miriam's punishment for complaining was that she became ----
- 4.33 Miriam had to stay outside the camp for --- days because of her leprosy
- 4.34 Moses sent out a leader of each clan to explore the land of ---
- 4.35 The time leaders were sent out to explore the land was the season of ---
- 4.36 The leaders sent out to spy Canaan spent --- days
- 4.37 The report of the leaders showed that they were --- of the people living in the land
- 4.38 Caleb of the clan of --- was the only brave one
- 4.39 Caleb advised that ----
- 4.40 To discourage going into the land, the leaders claimed that the people there were --- and they felt like ---
- 4.41 As a result of the report from those who explored the land of Canaan, the Israelites wanted to choose a leader and ---
- 4.42 ---- joined Caleb in trying to convince the Israelites that the land is one flowing with --- and ---
- 4.43 For being brave, Caleb and Joshua risked being --- by the people
- 4.44 God was angry with the Israelites for rejecting the report of Joshua and Caleb and He wanted to send on them a ---
- 4.45 Moses reminded God of His declaration "The Lord is --- to anger, abounding in --- and forgiving sin and rebellion"
- 4.46 The Lord forgave the people but because of their disbelief in spite of all the miracles God had shown them, He said none of them will ---
- 4.47 Only --- among the generation of Israelites who treated the Lord with contempt will inherit the promised land
- 4.48 As part of their punishment, all Israelites above the age of 20 years will die in the desert before reaching the promised land except ---- and ---
- 4.49 The Israelites wandered in the desert for --- years; --- for each day of the 40 spent exploring the promised land
- 4.50 All those who explored the land except Caleb and Joshua immediately died of ---
- 4.51 The ground opened and swallowed ---, --, ---, other leaders and their supporters who grumbled against Moses and Aaron
- 4.52 To indicate to Israelites that God had chosen ---- as leader, the staff sprouted, ---, - --- and produced almonds overnight
- 4.53 Miriam died in --- in the Desert of ---
- 4.54 When God instructed Moses to speak to the rock so that it can bring out water, Moses ---- twice
- 4.55 The ---- refused to allow the Israelites to pass through their land
- 4.56 Aaron died on Mount ----
- 4.57 To save the Israelites from dying of snake venom, Moses had to make a --- on a --- for them to look on
- 4.58 Sihon, king of ---- and --- king of Bashan and their army were killed because they would not allow the Israelites to pass through their lands

- 4.59 Balak wanted ---- to put a curse on the Israelites
- 4.60 It was said of --- “those you bless are blessed and those you curse are cursed”
- 4.61 Balaam always --- before doing anything great or small
- 4.62 Balaam’s --- spoke when he was beaten
- 4.63 Balaam’s first oracle was a ---- for the Israelites
- 4.64 Balaam pronounced a total of --- oracles on the Israelites
- 4.65 The Israelites angered God by joining Moabites to worship ---
- 4.66 A total of --- Israelites had died of plague before Phinehas killed 2 offenders
- 4.67 God said Phinehas was ----
- 4.68 ----an Israelite was killed with the Midianite woman ----- he had relationship with
- 4.69 The second census of Israelites was done after the ---
- 4.70 When the ground opened and swallowed offending Israelites, some members of the family of --- were spared
- 4.71 The first women to demand and obtain their father’s property were daughters of --
- 4.72 Noah was one of the 5 daughters of --- who had no son
- 4.73 --- wanted God to select another leader so that the Israelites will not be “sheep without a shepherd”
- 4.74 God instructed Moses to go up the mountain in --- range to view the promised land
- 4.75 Priest --- obtained decisions through the --- before the Lord for Joshua
- 4.76 Balaam was killed when the Israelites fought against the ---
- 4.77 ---- and --- were trans-Jordan tribes because they settled their families on one side of the Jordan while they crossed to the other with the Israelite army
- 4.78 Six Levite towns were towns of refuge because --- could run to them and escape penalty before trial
- 4.79 An accused person must stay in the city of refuge until the death of the ---
- 4.80 Land is polluted by ---- and atoned by ----



5 *DEUTERONOMY*

- 5.1 God did not allow the Israelites to take possession of the land of ---- which belonged to the descendants of ---
- 5.2 The descendants of Esau lived in ---
- 5.3 The Zamzummites were tall and strong like the ----
- 5.4 King --- had a bed 13 feet long and 6 feet wide, made of iron
- 5.5 God instructed Moses to go up to the top of --- to view the promised land
- 5.6 ---- called God “a consuming fire and jealous God”
- 5.7 The 10 Commandments were written on 2 --- tablets
- 5.8 The 10 Commandments in Exodus --- are repeated in Deuteronomy ---
- 5.9 The Lord gave Israelites victory over many nations not because of their righteousness but because of the --- of those nations
- 5.10 ---- broke the stone tablets into pieces in anger because---
- 5.11 Moses fasted without food or --- 40 days and 40 nights because of ----
- 5.12 Moses had to ---- two stone tablets like the first ones
- 5.13 It was --- who wrote the Commandments on the stone tablets
- 5.14 If Israel obeyed all God’s laws, it will not --- from any nation but will --- to them and rule over them
- 5.15 ---- may marry beautiful captive women from other nations
- 5.16 A rebellious son should be ----
- 5.17 It is for a --- offence that a man is put to death and hung on a tree
- 5.18 No descendant of ---- and ---- may enter the Assembly of the Lord
- 5.19 The --- generation of Edomites and Egyptians may enter the assembly of god
- 5.20 It is a sin not to pay the daily wage of a poor man before ----
- 5.21 A person judged guilty must never be given more than --- lashes
- 5.22 Blessings for obedience include blessing of the --- of the womb
- 5.23 Moses said the Book of the Law should be kept in the ark as a --- against the Israelites because they were rebellious and ----
- 5.24 Moses sang a song of --- verses after reminding the Israelites of God’s laws

- 5.25 God told Moses that he will die on Mount ---- of the Abarim Range
- 5.26 From the top of ---, across from Jericho, God showed Moses the Promised land from Gilead to--- and as far as the Western --- and ----
- 5.27 Moses died at the age of ---
- 5.28 ---- knows where the grave of Moses is
- 5.29 No prophet has been in Israel like ----
- 5.30 ---- saw God face-to-face



6 ***JOSHUA***

- 6.1 The Promise Land extended from the dessert to---- and from river Euphrates to the ---- sea
- 6.2 The Lord said to Joshua “Do not let the Book of the Law depart from your ---, ---- on it day and night”
- 6.3 The Lord said if Joshua is careful to do everything in the Book of the Law, then he will be ---- and ---
- 6.4 Joshua sent --- men to spy the land, especially ---
- 6.5 The spies stayed in the house of a prostitute named ---
- 6.6 When asked to bring out the Israelites in her house, Rahab ----
- 6.7 Rahab had hidden the men in the ---- of her house
- 6.8 Rahab described the God of the Israelites as “-----”
- 6.9 Rahab made the Israelite spies promise to ---- of her family when they came to take the town
- 6.10 Rahab let the spies down by --- through her ----
- 6.11 Rahab’s house was part of -----
- 6.12 The sign that was used to mark Rahab’s house was -----
- 6.13 While marching out to the Jordan, the Israelites were to keep a distance of --- yards between them and the arc of the covenant
- 6.14 The priests carried ---- ahead of the Israelites
- 6.15 Even though the Jordan was at flood stage, as soon as the --- of the priests touched it, the water upstream piled up into a heap at town ----
- 6.16 The Israelites passed through the Jordan on ----
- 6.17 God instructed Joshua to ask leaders of the 12 tribes to take a ---- from the middle of the Jordan as a ---- to ----

- 6.18 Gilgal was on the ---- border of Jericho
- 6.19 For the sake of Israelites, God did to the Jordan what he had done to ----
- 6.20 The Israelites who got to the promised Land were circumcised at Gibeath Haaraloth in ----
- 6.21 ---- means “Today, I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you”
- 6.22 For the first time after crossing the Jordan, the Israelites celebrated the Passover in ----
- 6.23 Manna stopped dropping the day after ---- when the Israelites ate ----
- 6.24 Near ----, Joshua saw the Commander of The Lord’s Army
- 6.25 The Commander of The Lord’s Army instructed Joshua to take off his --- because he was standing on ----
- 6.26 In order to conquer Jericho, the Israelites marched round it --- daily for --- days and --- times on the --- day
- 6.27 The walls of Jericho came down at the sound of --- and --- from the Israelites
- 6.28 Every ---- in Jericho was killed except ----
- 6.29 Joshua pronounced an oath by ---- anyone who tried to rebuild the wall of Jericho
- 6.30 ---- stole some of the things from Jericho which were devoted to destruction
- 6.31 The first defeat the Israelites had after crossing the Jordan was by the people of ---
- 6.32 The Gibeonites lied and were able to deceive Joshua and the leaders of Israel into signing a --- of peace because ----
- 6.33 The Gibeonites were neighbours to the Israelites and were actually only about --- days journey away
- 6.34 The king of Jerusalem at the time of Joshua was ----
- 6.35 Five Amorite kings ganged up against Gibeon and attacked it because ----
- 6.36 At the battle in Gibeon, the --- who assisted the Gibeonites defeated the Amorites
- 6.37 As the Amorites fled from Gibeon, the Lord hurled --- at them and more of them died from it than the swords of the ---
- 6.38 --- spoke to the Lord and asked that the sun and moon should stand still over Gibeon and the sun stood in the --- of the sky for about ---
- 6.39 Five Amorite kings were imprisoned in a --- at Makkedah
- 6.40 There was still a lot of land to be taken when Joshua had become very old in the region of the --- and Geshurites
- 6.41 Judah’s portion of land extended down the territory of --- to the Desert of --- in the extreme ---
- 6.42 Joshua told the clans of Joseph and Manasseh not to be afraid of the --- who had iron chariots
- 6.43 After allotting portions of the Promised Land to clans, the Tent of the Meeting was set up at ---
- 6.44 The --- did not get portion of the Promised Land as other clans because ----
- 6.45 The clan of Benjamin was allotted the land between the clans of --- and ---
- 6.46 The Israelites gave --- Timnath Serah, the town in the hill country as requested
- 6.47 On request, the Levites were given some towns as --- out of the inheritance of other clans
- 6.48 The --- and --- and half-tribe of Manasseh went back across the Jordan after other clans had settled on their lands

- 6.49 The whole Assembly of Israel gathered at Shiloh and planned to war against their brothers on the other side of the Jordan because ----
- 6.50 The trans-Jordan Israelites built an altar on their side not as a rebellion but as a ---
- 6.51 The altar built by trans-Jordan Israelites was to remind generations to come that Israelites on both side of the Jordan have and share ----
- 6.52 The altar named “A Witness Between Us That The Lord is God” was not to be used for --- or ----
- 6.53 At the Assembly of the Israelites at Shechem, --- told the people “As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord”
- 6.54 Asked to throw away all foreign gods, the Israelites responded “we will --- the Lord and --- Him”
- 6.55 Having reminded the Israelites of God’s laws, Joshua told the Israelites “This --- will be a witness against us. It has heard all the words that the Lord said to us”
- 6.56 Joshua died at the age of --- years
- 6.57 ---- was buried at Timnath Serah, the land he inherited
- 6.58 Joseph’s bones were buried at ---
- 6.59 Eleazer, son of ---- was buried at ---
- 6.60 Israel served the Lord throughout the lifetime of --- and the --- who outlived him



7 JUDGES

- 7.1 When the Israelites asked --- who will be the first to go out and fight the Canaanites, He selected the clan of---
- 7.2 The men of Judah asked their brothers, the --- to go and fight with them
- 7.3 The king whose thumbs and --- were cut off by the men of Judah was ---
- 7.4 King --- had cut off the big toes and thumbs of 70 kings before
- 7.5 The king who was punished by the men of Judah thought he deserved it from God because he had meted out the same to 70 like him who had to ---- under his table
- 7.6 King --- who had gone to Bezek to fight was taken back to his town, Jerusalem where he died
- 7.7 --- said "I will give my daughter Acsah in marriage to whoever attacks and captures Kiriath Sepher"
- 7.8 --- won a bride because he captured a town
- 7.9 Caleb's daughter, ---- was given in marriage to her cousin ----, the son of her uncle
- 7.10 The woman who not only got land from her father-in-law but also got springs of water was ---
- 7.11 --- drove out three sons of Anak from Hebron
- 7.12 The Benjamites could not drive out the --- who lived in Jerusalem and they had to continue to live together
- 7.13 Just like they were treated in Egypt, when the Israelites became strong, they pressed the --- into forced labour
- 7.14 God was angry with Israelites who ---- the altars to other gods
- 7.15 As a result of Israel's ----, God did not drive out some inhabitants of the Promised Land

- 7.16 The --- told Israel that the inhabitants of Promised Land will be “ --- in your sides and their gods will be a snare to you”
- 7.17 The Israelites were subjects to ---, king of Moab for ---years
- 7.18 ---- had a double-edged sword about a foot and half long
- 7.19 A left-handed man called --- killed a king by pretending to be delivering God’s message
- 7.20 King --- was so fat that the sword used to kill him with its handle disappeared into his belly
- 7.21 There is a one-verse report in the Bible on ---- who struck down six hundred Philistines with an oxgoad and saved ---
- 7.22 King --- and his commander --- had nine hundred iron chariots and oppressed the Israelites for --- years
- 7.23 The female leader of Israel was a ----
- 7.24 ---- wife of Lappidoth was a fearless warrior
- 7.25 ----, a leader of Israel’s army would not go to war unless a woman warrior went with him
- 7.26 Commander ---- went to hide in the tent of a woman
- 7.27 ---- gave a soldier a milk drink and covered him before murdering him
- 7.28 A tired soldier trusted ----, the woman who deceived him and killed him with a tent peg
- 7.29 ---- was so powerful that she could hammer in a peg through a man’s --- and pin him to the ground
- 7.30 As the prophetess had said, the honor for Israel’s victory went to a ----
- 7.31 Deborah and Barak sang a song of the victory of ----
- 7.32 Deborah blessed --- in her song
- 7.33 The mother of --- watched through a window anticipating the victorious return of her son
- 7.34 ---- was threshing wheat under an oak tree in Ophrah when the angel of the Lord came to him
- 7.35 ---- threshed wheat in a winepress for fear of Midianites
- 7.36 The angel of the Lord said to --- “ The lord is with you, mighty warrior”
- 7.37 Like Moses, ---- thought he was not qualified to lead Israel out of bondage
- 7.38 ---- said his clan is the weakest in Manasseh and he, the --- in his family
- 7.39 Egypt was to Moses as ---- was to Gideon
- 7.40 The sign to confirm that it was the Lord speaking to Gideon came through a --- as was the case with Moses
- 7.41 Like ---, Gideon saw an angel of the Lord face-to-face
- 7.42 God instructed Gideon to tear down his father’s altar to ---
- 7.43 Gideon was also to cut down the ---- pole
- 7.44 ---- was afraid of his family, so he carried out God’s instructions in the night
- 7.45 --- said “ If Baal were really a god, he can defend himself when someone breaks down his altar”
- 7.46 Gideon’s name was changed to --- because he broke down Baal’s altar
- 7.47 ---, a servant to Gideon went with him to spy the Midianite camp
- 7.48 Gideon won a battle by making his men blow trumpets and break----
- 7.49 God told ---- he had too many soldiers for a battle

- 7.50 Twenty-two thousand soldiers turned back from a battle led by ---- because of fear
- 7.51 God sifted an army of 32,000 to --- by watching how they took water before fighting the Midianites
- 7.52 Soldiers who lapped water like dogs had ---'s recommendation to fight a battle
- 7.53 Disclosure of the sensitive meaning of a dream without ensuring there were no other listeners resulted in the defeat of a ---- army
- 7.54 An army so large that it looked "thick as locusts" was defeated by just 300 ---
- 7.55 A whole army of ---, --- and --- was confused at the sound of trumpets and smashed jars
- 7.56 Instead of shouting "For the Lord and for Gideon" as an army was instructed, it shouted "A ---- for the Lord and for Gideon"
- 7.57 As the ---- soldiers ran out of a camp crying, other soldiers turned on each other, killing themselves
- 7.58 Two Midianite leaders, --- and --- were killed at a rock and winepress bearing their names respectfully
- 7.59 ---- overheard a soldier's --- about how a loaf barley bread hit the Midianite tent with so much force that the tent overturned and collapsed
- 7.60 An interpreter of a dream was so specific that he mentioned the name of warrior --- who would surely defeat a very large army.
- 7.61 For not giving his troop bread, Gideon vowed that after capturing --- and --- he will tear the flesh of the people of --- with briars and dessert thorns
- 7.62 Rather than mete out the same punishment to the people of --- who demonstrated the same attitude as the people of Succoth, Gideon vowed to tear down their ---
- 7.63 ---- was taunted by some officials who said "Do you already have the hands of Zebah and Zalmunnah in your possession?"
- 7.64 More than one hundred and twenty-thousand swordsmen ganged up against the ---
- 7.65 Gideon's oldest son ---- was a small boy who went to war with him
- 7.66 Some of the men killed by Zebah and Zalmunnah were --- of Gideon's mother
- 7.67 ---- asked a man, his son and grandson to rule over them
- 7.68 It was the custom of ---- to wear gold earrings
- 7.69 ---- refused to rule over a group of people saying "The Lord will rule over you"
- 7.70 The --- people had so much wealth that even their camels wore ornaments
- 7.71 A gold ephod made from the spoils of a war became an object of worship for ---
- 7.72 An ephod in his hometown, Ophrah became a snare to --- and his family
- 7.73 During Gideon's time, Israelites enjoyed peace for --- years
- 7.74 Gideon had --- sons
- 7.75 Abimelech was a son born to Gideon by a ---- in Shechem
- 7.76 ---- hired reckless adventurers as followers
- 7.77 ---- murdered his seventy half-brothers on one stone
- 7.78 The --- of the man who killed seventy of his half-brothers was a slave girl
- 7.79 ---- the Gideon's youngest son used parables to describe the injustice of Israelites who crowned Abimelech king
- 7.80 --- fled to Beer because he was afraid of his brother
- 7.81 --- and his brothers cursed Abimelech
- 7.82 ---- deceived Gaal by saying "you mistake the shadows of the mountains for men"

- 7.83 As Jotham had proclaimed (cursed) that Abimelech and the people of Shechem will consume each other, the people fought with --- against their king
- 7.84 Abimelech killed the people of Shechem and scattered --- over their land
- 7.85 --- set fire on more than one thousand people in a tower
- 7.86 A woman dropped an upper millstone on and cracked ----'s skull
- 7.87 --- did not want it to be known that a woman killed him
- 7.88 Abimelech was killed by the ---- of his ---
- 7.89 Two verses in the Bible are devoted to the twenty-three years reign of --- the grandson of Dodo
- 7.90 The thirty sons of --- rode thirty donkeys and controlled thirty towns in Gilead
- 7.91 Gilead's son ---- whose mother was a --- was driven from his father's house by his half-brothers
- 7.92 --- was an only child who had to be sacrificed because of the father's vow
- 7.93 ---- asked to be allowed to roam the hills for two months to weep with her friends because she will never marry
- 7.94 It is a custom in Israel that each year young women go out for --- to commemorate Jephthah's daughter
- 7.95 To identify the Ephraimites, they were made to pronounce ---
- 7.96 Ephraimites pronounced "Shibboleth" as ----
- 7.97 --- of --- gave away 30 daughters in marriage to other clans and brought 30 wives from other clans for his sons
- 7.98 Samson was the son of ---Nazirites are not allowed to use ---
- 7.99 --- and his wife watched as an angel of the Lord went up in the flames of their burnt offering
- 7.100 --- was warned by an angel not to drink wine or fermented drinks
- 7.101 --- wanted a Phillistine wife
- 7.102 Samson tore a young --- apart with bare hands
- 7.103 Samson got honey from a ----'s carcass
- 7.104 Samson's riddle "out of the eater, something to eat; out of the strong, something sweet" referred to a --- and ---
- 7.105 Samson's wife cried for --- days because he did not divulge the meaning of his riddle
- 7.106 Samson's wife was given to his ---
- 7.107 Samson tied – foxes tail-to-tail and fastened torches to the tails to burn --- farms
- 7.108 ---- retaliated by burning Samson's wife and her ---
- 7.109 With a donkey's ----, Samson killed a thousand men
- 7.110 Samson, celebrating said " With a donkey's --- I have made --- of them"
- 7.111 Samson threw away his donkey's jawbone at ---
- 7.112 Samson led Israel for --- years
- 7.113 Samson spent a night in --- and uprooted the city gate
- 7.114 Samson fell in love with a woman named --- in the valley of ---
- 7.115 Delilah got Samson to tell her the secret of his strength when she nagged saying " How can you say ---- when you won't confide in me?"
- 7.116 The Spirit of the Lord and strength left Samson when Delilah ----
- 7.117 Philistines gouged out the eyes of ----
- 7.118 On the roof of a temple, there were about --- people watching Samson perform

- 7.119 Samson pushed on two --- pillars of a temple which collapsed
- 7.120 The son of --- killed more people when he died than when he lived
- 7.121 When --- confessed that he stole her silver, she changed her curse to a blessing
- 7.122 When a thief returned 11 hundred shekels of silver, the owner said “I solemnly consecrate my silver to --- for my son to make a carved image and a cast idol”
- 7.123 There was no king in Israel when --- built a shrine in his house
- 7.124 --- asked a stranger from Judah to be his father and priest
- 7.125 An offer to be priest over the --- clan instead of a household made ---’s priest to desert him
- 7.126 The Danites killed a peaceful, unsuspecting people, took over their land --- and renamed it ---
- 7.127 The wicked men of --- were like those of Sodom who also said “bring out the men who came into your house so that we can have sex with them”
- 7.128 The master of a concubine who was raped in --- cut her into --- pieces that he sent to all the areas of Israel
- 7.129 Gibeah was in the land of ---
- 7.130 There were at least seven hundred men who were left handed in --- who could sling a stone at a --- and not miss
- 7.131 After almost wiping out the Benjamites, Israel found 400 virgins from --- for them to marry
- 7.132 Benjamites who could not get wives among 400 virgins had to kidnap girls from ---
-



8 RUTH

- 8.1 ---- took his wife and two sons to Moab because of a famine
- 8.2 ---- changed her name to --- that means “bitter”
- 8.3 Elimelech’s sons were --- and ---
- 8.4 Naomi’s sons married Moabites named ---- and ---
- 8.5 Naomi’s two sons after living for --- years in Moab
- 8.6 Naomi did not want her daughters-in-law to go back to --- with her
- 8.7 Both Naomi’s daughters-in-law wept and said “We will go back with you to your people” but --- did not go
- 8.8 Naomi and Ruth arrived in Bethlehem just as the --- harvest was beginning
- 8.9 Ruth went to collect left-over grains in the field of ---
- 8.10 Boaz was a relative of ----
- 8.11 ---- warned the men working in his field not to touch Ruth
- 8.12 The meal on Boaz’s field was bread dipped in --- and roasted ---
- 8.13 Boaz ---- his barley at night
- 8.14 Naomi instructed Ruth to gain the attention of Boaz when he is at the ---
- 8.15 To gain Boaz’s attention, Ruth uncovered his--- while he laid down
- 8.16 Boaz knew another ---- who was a closer relative to Elimelech
- 8.17 Boaz called --- elders to be witnesses when they discussed redeeming of Elimelech’s properties
- 8.18 The closer relative of Elimelech wanted to redeem the land but not ----
- 8.19 In Israel, to legalise a transaction on redemption and transfer of property, one of those concerned would----
- 8.20 The witnesses to Boaz’s transaction prayed “May the Lord make the woman who is coming to your home like --- and ---“

- 8.21 Ruth was said to be better than --- sons
- 8.22 The Israeli elders wanted the family through the offspring of Boaz and Ruth to be like that of --- son of Judah and ---
- 8.23 Obed was cared for by his ----
- 8.24 Boaz's father was ----
- 8.25 Boaz was the ---- of David





9 *1* SAMUEL

- 9.1 Samuel's father was an Ephraimite from ----
- 9.2 Elkanah, Samuel's father had two wives --- and ---
- 9.3 Elkanah went to --- annually to worship the Lord
- 9.4 The priests at Shiloh were --- and--- the sons of ---
- 9.5 Elkanah gave portions of meat to --- and her sons and daughters
- 9.6 --- received double portion of meet because her husband loved her and she was ---
- 9.7 Whenever they went to the house of the Lord ---- provoked Hannah until she wept
- 9.8 Whenever Hannah was sad, Elkanah asked whether he did not mean more than --- sons to her
- 9.9 Hannah promised the Lord that if He gave her a son she will "give him to --- for all the days of his life and no --- will touch his head"
- 9.10 As she prayed, Hannah's --- lips were moving but her --- was not heard
- 9.11 Eli, watching Hannah pray thought she was ---
- 9.12 Hannah described her prayer as -----
- 9.13 When Hannah was childless, she --- so much that she could not eat but one day, she ate after ----

- 9.14 Samuel means -----
- 9.15 Hannah did not go to Shiloh after the birth of her son until ---
- 9.16 Samuel ministered before the Lord under---
- 9.17 Eli's sons treated the Lord's offerings with---
- 9.18 Each year, Samuel's mother made a --- for him
- 9.19 Eli used to bless Elkanah and ---
- 9.20 Hannah had --- more sons and --- daughters
- 9.21 Eli's sons did not listen to their father's rebuke because ---
- 9.22 God sent a messenger to Eli whom God said honoured --- more than Him
- 9.23 When God called him, --- did not yet know the Lord
- 9.24 When God called the ---- time, Samuel did not run to Eli but answered the Lord
- 9.25 God swore that the sins of the house of Eli will never be atoned for by ---
- 9.26 Instead of Eli seeking the Lord for ---- of the sins of his family, he simply said "He is the Lord, let him do what is good in his eyes"
- 9.27 The Philistines who were fighting the Israelites were afraid when they heard that --- had been brought into the camp
- 9.28 Eli died on the same day as his ---
- 9.29 Eli fell backward, breaking his neck when he heard that----
- 9.30 Eli died at the age of --- years
- 9.31 Eli's --- went into labour when she heard about the death of eli and his sons.
- 9.32 Eli's grandson, born soon after he died was named ---- by ---
- 9.33 The name ----- means "the glory has departed from Israel"
- 9.34 The glory of God had departed from Israel because----
- 9.35 The Philistines captured the arc of the Lord and took it from--- to ---
- 9.36 When the arc was put beside Dagon, --- of the Philistines, Dagon fell face ---
- 9.37 When Dagon was put back in place, it fell again before the arc, breaking its --- and ---
- 9.38 The ---- and all who entered Dagon's temple could not step on the ---- because Dagon's broken head and arms had been found lying there
- 9.39 God brought devastation and afflicted the people of Ashdod and its vicinity with --- because of the ---
- 9.40 When the arc was moved to --- and ---, it caused deaths and tumors
- 9.41 The people of --- cried out so much that their cries reached heaven
- 9.42 After --- months the priests and --- were consulted on what to do with arc
- 9.43 The Philistines were advised to send the arc back to Israel with a ---
- 9.44 The guilt offering that followed the arc included --- and ---
- 9.45 The five gold tumors represented the ---- and ---- gold rats represented the number of Philistine --- belonging to them
- 9.46 The priests and diviners asked the Philistines why they had --- their hearts as the Egyptians and Pharaoh did
- 9.47 The arc of the Lord was to be transported on a --- cart pulled by cows that have --- but never been ---
- 9.48 The proof that the deaths and tumors were from the God of Israel was if the cart went towards---- in its own territory
- 9.49 The cows pulling the cart that carried the arc of the Lord went straight toward ---
- 9.50 When the Israelites saw the cart conveying the arc, they ---

- 9.51 The first place that the cart conveying the arc stopped was the field of ---
- 9.52 The Israelites ---- the cart which brought the arc of the Lord to them and --- the cows for ---
- 9.53 The guilt offerings sent by the Philistines represented Ashdod, ----, Ashkelon, ---- and ---
- 9.54 A total of --- people died in Beth Shemesh because they ---- the arc
- 9.55 From Beth Shemesh, the arc was taken to the house of --- in Kiriath Jearim
- 9.56 The arc remained in Kiriath Jearim for --- years
- 9.57 While Israel assembled and Samuel was offering burnt offerings at Mizpah, the --- attacked them
- 9.58 The stone set up by Samuel between Mizpah and Shen, after Israel defeated the Philistines was named ----
- 9.59 Samuel named a place Ebenezer saying “Thus far has ---- ----- us”
- 9.60 Throughout -----’s lifetime, the hand of the Lord was against the Philistines
- 9.61 On yearly basis, Samuel went on a circuit judging Israel between Bethel, --- and Mizpah
- 9.62 Samuel’s home was in ---
- 9.63 The name of Samuel’s firstborn was ----
- 9.64 Samuel appointed ---- as judges for Israel
- 9.65 Joel and Abijah, Samuel’s sons served in ---
- 9.66 Like Eli, Samuel’s --- did not walk in his way
- 9.67 Israelites asked Samuel to appoint a ---- because his sons were dishonest, accepted ---- and perverted ---
- 9.68 When Samuel prayed, God told him that in asking for a king, it was not --- that the Israelites rejected but ----
- 9.69 Samuel tried to discourage the Israelites from choosing a king by saying that their sons will be ---- and their daughters ---
- 9.70 Israel wanted a king so that they will be like ---
- 9.71 Kish, a Benjamite was the --- of Saul
- 9.72 Saul was a head ---- than any in Israel
- 9.73 Saul’s father sent him out to look for his lost ----
- 9.74 Saul was reluctant to go and consult the man of God concerning the lost donkeys because he had no ---- for him
- 9.75 In Israel prophets were called ---
- 9.76 Israelites do not eat when sacrificing to the Lord until the ---- blesses it
- 9.77 The day before Saul got to Samuel, God had asked Samuel to ----
- 9.78 ---- said to ---- “This is the man I spoke about; he will govern my people”
- 9.79 Like ---- Saul thought he did not fit the post of a leader because his clan was the least (weakest) of his tribe and he the (least) youngest in the family.
- 9.80 ---- and his father’s --- were special guests of honour at a dinner with prophet Samuel
- 9.81 ---- anointed ---- by pouring oil on his head and then kissed him saying “ has not --- anointed you leader of his inheritance”
- 9.82 Prophet ---- told --- that he will meet a group of prophets and ---- will come upon him so that he also will begin to prophesy

- 9.83 Seeing a spectacular occurrence, by-standers asked “Is --- also among the prophets?”
- 9.84 Saul told his uncle that the donkeys had been found but did not tell him what prophet Samuel had said about ----
- 9.85 ---- hid himself among baggage because he did not want to become a king
- 9.86 Saul was a handsome man and a --- taller than all the people of Israel
- 9.87 ---- wrote regulations on kingship on a ---- and laid it before God
- 9.88 ---- threatened to gouge out the right eyes of the people of --- as a treaty
- 9.89 When --- heard about the plight of the people of Jabesh, he cut 2 oxen into pieces and threatened to do same to the oxen of ---
- 9.90 A piece of meat and a message from --- made 300,000 men of Israel and 30,000 men of Judah join an army
- 9.91 Victory over the --- convinced the people of Israel that Saul well deserved to be made their king
- 9.92 Saul’s kingship was confirmed before the Lord with fellowship offerings and great celebration at ---
- 9.93 The farewell speech of ---- was a reminder to Israel of the consequences of disobedience
- 9.94 Saul was --- years old when he became king and he reigned for --- years
- 9.95 Saul lived with two thousand soldiers in --- while his son --- lived with a thousand at ---
- 9.96 A challenge from the Philistines made ---- soldiers hide in caves
- 9.97 Seeing his troop quaking with fear, Saul sinned by --- at Gilgal
- 9.98 The --- of Saul would have lasted forever but for his impatience and not seeking --- the right way
- 9.99 There was no blacksmith in --- so they had to go and sharpen their implements with the ---
- 9.100 Saul had ---, a priest and son of Ichabod with his army
- 9.101 ---- and his armour-bearer killed 20 Phillistines in an area of about half an acre
- 9.102 Jonathan ate --- not knowing that a fast had been declared by Saul
- 9.103 When God did not answer Saul, he knew someone had sinned and they had to --- to know who did
- 9.104 Jonathan’s brothers were --- and ---
- 9.105 Saul’s oldest daughter was --- and the youngest ---
- 9.106 Saul’s cousin --- was a commander in Saul’s army
- 9.107 When Saul attacked the Amalekites, he disobeyed God’s instructions by ----
- 9.108 --- set up a monument in his own honour at Carmel
- 9.109 ----- said to --- “To obey is better than sacrifice”
- 9.110 Rebellion is like the sin of ---
- 9.111 --- is like the evil of idolatory
- 9.112 As --- tore the robe of prophet ---, he said to him “The lord has torn the kingdom of --- from you today and has given it to one of your --- “
- 9.113 God is not man that he should change his ---
- 9.114 --- was killed by Samuel with a sword because his own --- had made women childless
- 9.115 Samuel was afraid --- would kill him if he anointed --- king

- 9.116 Man looks at the outward appearance but God looks at ---
- 9.117 ---- was the first to serve Israel as king
- 9.118 --- introduced his 8 sons to prophet Samuel
- 9.119 --- was a handsome shepherd with ruddy cheeks
- 9.120 Samuel anointed David in the presence of ---
- 9.121 King Saul sent his messengers to the father of a harpist called ---
- 9.122 King Saul liked the shepherd ---- and made him of his armour-bearers
- 9.123 --- a Philistine soldier challenged Israel and the God of Israel every morning and evening for ---days
- 9.124 ---- of Jesse's sons joined Saul's army but David went back and forth from Saul to ---- at Bethlehem
- 9.125 Israelites ran away in great fear anytime they saw ----
- 9.126 ---, David's oldest brother rebuke him for being inquisitive and leaving the --- unattended
- 9.127 as young as David was, what he said was overheard and reported to ----
- 9.128 ---- said "Let no one lose heart on account of this Philistine, your --- will go and fight him"
- 9.129 David had faith in the God of Israel and said " the God who saved me from the --- of --- and the --- of --- will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine"
- 9.130 Goliath was a well armed and protected soldier having heavy bronze ----, ----, ---, and --- as well as an iron tipped ---
- 9.131 David faced Goliath with only ---- and ---- but had faith in ----
- 9.132 David was not used to dressing as a ----
- 9.133 Goliath cursed David by his ---
- 9.134 ---- asked a young shepherd "Am I a dog that you come at me with sticks?"
- 9.135 David boasted that his God does not rely on --- and ---- for victory
- 9.136 David was so brave that he --- the battle line
- 9.137 In spite of the shield carried by Goliath's --- and bronze --- , David's pebble struck Goliath on the ----
- 9.138 Goliath fell --- on the ground
- 9.139 ---- used Goliath's sword to cut off his head in the valley of ---
- 9.140 When David finished talking with the father of ---, he, --- loved David as himself
- 9.141 ---- made a covenant of friendship with David with his ---, ---, ----, ---- and ---
- 9.142 Saul was angry and jealous of David because the women in their song claimed ---- for David
- 9.143 David eluded Saul --- times when he wanted to pin him to a --- with a ---
- 9.144 Out of fear, Saul sent David away to command an army of --- soldiers
- 9.145 ---- became David's enemy because of jealousy
- 9.146 David thought himself unworthy of becoming Saul's ---
- 9.147 Saul wanted David to marry his first daughter ---- but gave her to ---- because of David's ---
- 9.148 Saul's youngest daughter ---- loved David
- 9.149 David gave Saul ----, which was --- times what Saul asked for in order to have --- as wife
- 9.150 Michal saved her husband by letting him down through a ----
- 9.151 ---- escaped from Saul because his wife put an idol on his bed to represent him

- 9.152 David and Jonathan planned to prove Saul's intension to --- David by watching if Saul lost or kept his --- on noticing David's absence
- 9.153 Jonathan realized that his father wanted to kill --- when Saul hurled his spear at ---
- 9.154 Jonathan asked David to hide by stone --- and listen out for his instructions to a boy
- 9.155 David was safe if Jonathan said to a boy " the arrows are on --- of you "
- 9.156 Saul noticed David's absence from the New moon festival meals but did not complain until the ---- day
- 9.157 ---- was so angry he left a festival meal without
- 9.158 Saul suspected Jonathan's cover up for David and in anger called his son " son of a ---- and --- woman"
- 9.159 David bowed down before ---- three times with his face to the ground
- 9.160 David lied to priest ---- that he was on king Saul's mission
- 9.161 The priest gave David ---- bread and Goliath's ---
- 9.162 ----, Saul's head shepherd was there when David collected things from priest Ahimelech
- 9.163 David pretended to be insane because he feared king ---
- 9.164 David feigned insanity by scratching on ---- and making saliva run down his ---
- 9.165 Achish was the king of ---
- 9.166 David's brothers and father's household went to him at the cave of ---
- 9.167 David, himself a fugitive, became the leader of about ---- distressed or discontented men
- 9.168 In Mizpah, David pleaded with the king of --- to accommodate his mother and father
- 9.169 It was prophet --- who advised David to leave Moab for the land of ----
- 9.170 King --- accused his officials of disloyalty in a matter concerning his son
- 9.171 Priest Ahimelech was accused of --- by king Saul
- 9.172 When Saul's officials refused to kill the priests, --- killed --- of them
- 9.173 All the people and animals living in ---, the priests' town except ---were killed because Saul believed that they sided with ---
- 9.174 David persuaded Abiathar to stay with him because he felt responsible for the deaths of Abiathar's --- and because the same man --- was after both of them
- 9.175 David inquired of the Lord --- times before going to fight the Philistines in Keila
- 9.176 Saul was sure to catch David in Keila because it was a town with --- and ---
- 9.177 ---- told David that Saul would come after him and the people of Keila whom he helped will hand him and his men to Saul
- 9.178 --- was the priest with David and his men
- 9.179 David and about --- men moved about and stayed in strongholds in the Dessert of ---
- 9.180 ---- went to David at Horesh in the dessert and helped him find strength in God
- 9.181 ---- told David that he, David will be king over Israel while he, --- will be second in command
- 9.182 A raid by the --- prevented Saul from continuing his chase of David in the Dessert of ---
- 9.183 The --- whom David helped betrayed him by going to disclose where he was hiding to Saul

- 9.184 Saul went after David with three thousand men when he was informed that David was in the Desert of ---
- 9.185 David and his men were far back in the same cave that --- stopped to rest
- 9.186 As evidence that he could have killed Saul, David --- of Saul
- 9.187 David did not allow his men to attack Saul because Saul was ---
- 9.188 David went out of the cave before shouting “----“
- 9.189 David --- before Saul
- 9.190 David called Saul --- and Saul in response called David ---
- 9.191 Saul --- knowing that David could have killed him easily but spared him
- 9.192 Saul affirmed that --- will be king and made David swear that his --- will not be cut off or his own --- wiped out from his family.
- 9.193 It was after Samuel’s death that David moved to the Desert of ---
- 9.194 ---- though a wealthy man was ungrateful, mean and rude to David
- 9.195 ----, wiser than her husband averted a massacre planned by David when she supplied him with ---- and ----
- 9.196 Nabal was having a banquet like a --- and was ---, so his wife did not tell him of what David would have done until the next morning
- 9.197 Nabal’s --- failed him and he became like a stone, eventually dying --- days later
- 9.198 David asked Abigail to ---- him and she did.
- 9.199 David’s wives were --- and --- because Saul had given Michal to ----
- 9.200 Saul went after David again while he was hiding in the hill of ---
- 9.201 David had opportunity to kill Saul again when Saul, his army commander, --- and army slept in a camp
- 9.202 --- followed David to Saul’s camp
- 9.203 To prove Saul’s vulnerability, David took the --- and --- by Saul’s head
- 9.204 Saul and his army did not wake up when David went into their camp because ---
- 9.205 After taking Saul’s belongings, David called out to --- and --- from the other side of a hill
- 9.206 ---- responded to David’s call to the army from the other side of a hill, saying “who are you who calls to the king?”
- 9.207 David described what Saul was doing, chasing after him as “ a king looking for a ---“
- 9.208 Saul stopped searching for David when David moved to --- of the Philistines
- 9.209 David initially lived with Achish, the king of Gath in the --- city
- 9.210 David stayed in Ziklag of the Philistines for ---- months
- 9.211 ---- was so deceived that he thought David would be his servant forever
- 9.212 Saul who had driven all mediums out of the land disguised and consulted a female medium at ---
- 9.213 Saul asked the medium to bring --- up because God was no longer talking to him and he needed to find out the outcome of his planned battle with ---
- 9.214 --- and his men wept until they had no more strength to weep because their wives and children had been captured
- 9.215 When they got to --- ravine, 200 of David’s men were too exhausted to cross
- 9.216 David’s men found an--- who had been among the men who raided David’s settlement
- 9.217 David killed all the Amalekites who raided Ziklag except 400 who escaped on---

- 9.218 David recovered all that had been taken from Ziklag but some of his men did not want to share the plunder with---
- 9.219 David a statute and ordinance for Israel that says “ The --- of the man who stayed with the supplies is to be the same as that of him who ----“
- 9.220 In the battle against the Philistines, --- killed himself, and his --- sons died the same day on Mount --- but were buried in ---





10 2SAMUEL

- 10.1 A young --- lied that he killed Saul and was ordered to be ---- by David for liftring his hand to destroy the Lord’s anointed
- 10.2 David sang a dirge for ---- and ---- saying “How the mighty men have fallen”
- 10.3 David was crowned king at --- by the men of -----
- 10.4 ---- blessed the people of Jabesh Gilead for burying Saul
- 10.5 David was king over Judah for ----
- 10.6 ---- could run like a gazelle (deer)
- 10.7 ----- murdered Asahel because he refused to stop chasing him
- 10.8 Abner and ----- were responsible for the fight that led to the young men of David’s family and Saul’s family killing each other
- 10.9 ---- was David’s first son
- 10.10 David sent to----, son of Saul “ give me my wife Michal”
- 10.11 ---- was --- behind his wife whom David demanded for until Abner asked him to go back home
- 10.12 ---- killed Abner to avenge the blood of his brother Asahel
- 10.13 ---- wept, sang and fasted and the people knew that he had no hand in the killing of Abner
- 10.14 ---- was a --- years old boy dropped by his nurse and lame for life

- 10.15 ---- and ---- killed Ish-Bosheth when he was having his afternoon rest
- 10.16 The two men who killed Ish-Bosheth had their --- and --- cut off at David's order
- 10.17 The saying "the lame and blind will not enter the palace" originated from the fight between David and the ---
- 10.18 After he left Hebron, David took more wives and concubines from-----
- 10.19 ---- was struck down by God for touching arc when the oxen conveying it stumbled
- 10.20 When the arc was brought out of the house of, ---- David and the whole of Israel danced to various types of --- instruments
- 10.21 ---- disapproved of the way her husband danced before the maidens
- 10.22 David was feared having the arc in ---- so he took it to the house of Obed-Edom
- 10.23 David lived in a house made of ----
- 10.24 ---- prayed to God for a blessing on his house
- 10.25 David made ---- lie down, measured them with a cord and killed every two lengths of them
- 10.26 David became famous after striking down 18,000 ----- at the valley of Salt
- 10.27 ---- was David's recorder
- 10.28 David's secretary was ----
- 10.29 Among David's officials, his sons were royal---
- 10.30 --- was a servant of Saul who had 15 sons and 20 servants
- 10.31 ---- arranged for Mephibosheth, a lame man to always eat at the same table with him
- 10.32 David was kind to ---- because of his friendship with the father, Jonathan
- 10.33 David caught sight of a beautiful woman ---- as he strolled the palace roof
- 10.34 ---- was the father of Bathsheba and --- her husband
- 10.35 --- was sent to the war front because king David wanted his wife
- 10.36 ---- refused to go to his house to sleep while his colleagues were at war
- 10.37 God sent prophet --- to tell king David of the sin he committed
- 10.38 Nathan told a story of a man who had many ---- and --- but took away the only --- owned by a poor man to make David realize he had sinned
- 10.39 "You did it in secret but I will do this thing in broad daylight before all Israel" was God's pronouncement of punishment for -----'s wrongdoing
- 10.40 --- fasted because he did not want the child born to him by another man's wife to die
- 10.41 Asked why he was looking haggard, ---- said he was in love
- 10.42 ----, a shrewed man advised his friend to pretend to be ill so that he can rape his half sister
- 10.43 ---- lived in the house of her brother, Absalom a desolate woman
- 10.44 --- , king David's son became a fugitive after having his half brother killed
- 10.45 King David's heart longed for his son Absalom who stayed away from home for --- years
- 10.46 ---- told a woman to pretend to be mourning so that she can deliver his message to king David
- 10.47 --- brought Absalom who had been in exile back home
- 10.48 --- was so beautiful that from the top of his head to the sole of his foot there was no blemish
- 10.49 --- intercepted subjects who wanted to see the king and stole the heart of the people
- 10.50 Absalom conspired against ----
- 10.51 ---- a Gittite, refused to leave king David when he fled from his son
- 10.52 King David wept as he climbed ---- barefooted

- 10.53 David asked --- to go back and serve Absalom so that he can frustrate the advice of Ahitophel
- 10.54 King David gave all that belonged to Mephibosheth to ----
- 10.55 ----, an enemy to David from Saul's family cursed and pelted David and his men with stones
- 10.56 --- was a false friend to king David who deflected to Absalom's side
- 10.57 ---- and ---- hid in a well as they ran away from Absalom
- 10.58 ---- hanged himself because his advice was not followed by Absalom
- 10.59 ----, ---- and ---- brought food, bedding and other supplies to David and his men while in pursuit of Absalom
- 10.60 ---- was told not to go to war because he was worth 10,000 soldiers
- 10.61 As ---- rode his mule, his head got in the branches of an oak tree leaving him hanging
- 10.62 ---- plunged 3 --- into Absalom's heart
- 10.63 Absalom was buried in a pit with large ---- piled over him
- 10.64 --- and the ---- each wanted to reach the king David first because they thought they were taking good news him
- 10.65 King David ---- the death of his son, wishing he had died instead
- 10.66 Victory turned into mourning for the army of --- when his enemy son was killed
- 10.67 --- a relative of David was appointed captain to replace Joab
- 10.68 ---- had not taken care of his feet, or trimmed his mustach or washed his clothes from the day David left until he returned Jerusalem
- 10.69 ----, a wealthy --- years old man was invited to come and live in Jerusalem with king David whom he had been kind to
- 10.70 --- was a replacement for the king's hospitality because an old man did not want to cross the Jordan
- 10.71 ---- was said to be a city that is a mother in Israel
- 10.72 ----, a military officer was advised to kill one man rather than massacre a whole city
- 10.73 When the head of --- was thrown out of a city, the whole community was saved
- 10.74 --- watched over the bodies of her two sons through a barley season
- 10.75 --- saved king David from being killed by giant Ishbi-Benob
- 10.76 When a giant was killed, --- swore "Never again will you go out with us to battle, so that the lamp of Israel will not be extinguished"
- 10.77 David's troop killed a total of --- descendants of the "giant of Gath"
- 10.78 ---- killed a giant who had six fingers on each hand and six toes on each foot
- 10.79 The whole of chapter --- of 2 Samuel is David's Song of Praise
- 10.80 ----, David's chief captain killed 800 men in one battle
- 10.81 One of David's mighty men ----, when deserted by his troops single-handedly defeated Philistines
- 10.82 The "Three Mighty Men" of David's army risked their lives by passing through ---- to get the king a ----
- 10.83 ---- one of David's mighty men killed a lion and armed with only a club overpowered an Egyptian who a spear
- 10.84 ---- was opposed by Joab when he wanted a census of all the fighting men of Irsael and Judah
- 10.85 Josheb-Basshebeth was one of David's --- mighty men
- 10.86 ---- struck down Philistines until his hand grew tired and froze to the sword

- 10.87 David had --- men of honour
- 10.88 Abishai was the ---- of the Three mighty Men even though he was not included among them
- 10.89 Even though they were called “the Thirty”, they were actually ---- in number
- 10.90 Uriah the Hittite was one of David’s ----
- 10.91 When the angel of the Lord was killing people at Araunah’s threshing floor, David called them ---
- 10.92 After a census, Joab reported the number of able bodied men who could handle a ---
- 10.93 The number of men who could fight were --- for Israel and --- for Judah
- 10.94 Prophet ---- gave David 3 options of punishment from God
- 10.95 The first alternative of God’s punishment for David was --- years of famine
- 10.96 One of the options for David’s punishment for having a census of soldiers was 3 --- of fleeing from his enemy
- 10.97 The punishment God sent on David and Israel was ----
- 10.98 After seventy thousand men had died and the angel stretched his hand toward ---, the Lord was grieved
- 10.99 David bought the threshing floor of ---- to build an altar
- 10.100 Instead of accepting a threshing floor as a gift --- said “I will not --- to the Lord my God burnt offerings that cost me nothing”



11 *KINGS*

- 11.1 King --- in his old age could not keep warm even when covered
- 11.2 Abishag a ---- was the young, beautiful girl who waited on king David in his old age
- 11.3 Absalom's immediate brother, ----- pronounced himself king without his father's knowledge
- 11.4 ---- informed Bathsheba about Adonija's kingship
- 11.5 King David asked prophet --- and priest--- to anoint Solomon over Israel
- 11.6 Solomon was anointed king at ---
- 11.7 --- afraid of his younger brother went and took hold of the horns of the altar as protection
- 11.8 David advised --- to obey the Laws of Moses so that he may prosper in all he does
- 11.9 David charged Solomon to deal with ---- in his wisdom but not to allow his gray hair to go down to the grave in peace
- 11.10 King David advised his son to show kindness to the sons of ----
- 11.11 David was buried in ---
- 11.12 David ruled for --- years in Hebron and---- years in Jerusalem
- 11.13 Adonijah asked Bathsheba to request Solomon to give him --- as wife
- 11.14 King Solomon ordered that Adonijah be--- because of his request
- 11.15 A throne was ordered for --- to sit by her royal son
- 11.16 Solomon removed --- from being a priest to fulfill the word of the Lord spoken concerning the house of --- at Shiloh
- 11.17 God gave --- a choice of anything he wants in a dream and he chose wisdom
- 11.18 In addition to wisdom, God gave Solomon --- and ---

- 11.19 God promised Solomon that if he kept his laws and walked in his way, He will give him ---
- 11.20 The first test of Solomon's wisdom was the judgment between two women who argued on ownership of a ---
- 11.21 --- was the author of 3000 proverbs
- 11.22 Solomon wrote one thousand and five ---
- 11.23 Solomon had ---- thousand stalls of horses for his chariots and --- horsemen
- 11.24 Solomon and king --- of Tyre made a treaty with each other
- 11.25 King Hiram gave Solomon timbers of cedar and fir from ----
- 11.26 In exchange for logs, the king of Hiram wanted ---
- 11.27 Solomon started to build the Temple --- years after the Israelites left Egypt
- 11.28 The temple was --- cubits (---metres) long
- 11.29 It took Solomon --- years to build his palace
- 11.30 --- designed the brass (bronze) columns of Solomon's Temple
- 11.31 As the priests were leaving the temple Solomon built on the day of its dedication to the Lord, it was suddenly filled with ----
- 11.32 ---- had wanted to build the Lord's Temple but God said it will be built by his son
- 11.33 Solomon prayed in the Temple in front of the ---
- 11.34 The dedication of the Temple lasted --- days
- 11.35 King Solomon sacrificed --- cattle and --- sheep as fellowship-offering at the dedication of the Temple
- 11.36 After he had built the Temple and palace, god appeared to Solomon again and said the temple will be where He shall be --- forever
- 11.37 It took Solomon --- years to build the Temple and his palace
- 11.38 Solomon gave king Hiram 20 towns in the region of --- which he did not like
- 11.39 King Hiram had given Solomon ---- of gold
- 11.40 For his forced labour, Solomon used the --- who were not killed when the Israelites took possession of their land
- 11.41 --- heard of king Solomon's wisdom and travelled to Jerusalem to test him with hard questions
- 11.42 King Solomon loved many foreign women and ---- foreign gods
- 11.43 Solomon married --- princesses and had --- concubines
- 11.44 Hadad was just a child when --- killed all males in Edom except Hadad and his father's servants who escaped to ---
- 11.45 Hadad went back to Edom after --- and --- had died
- 11.46 Hadad and --- king of Syria were enemies of Israel during Solomon's reign
- 11.47 One of Solomon's enemies was his official ---
- 11.48 Prophet --- told that the Lord said " I am going to take the kingdom away from Solomon and I will give you --- tribes
- 11.49 ----, son of Solomon succeeded him
- 11.50 ---- who fled to Egypt because Solomon wanted to kill him returned when Rehoboam became king
- 11.51 Rehoboam did not heed the advice of ---- on how to deal with the northern people
- 11.52 Rehoboam promised to make the burden of the northern tribes ---- and whip the with ---
- 11.53 When the people of Israel rebelled, Rehoboam was left with only --- to rule over

- 11.54 Jeroboam was made king over ----
- 11.55 ---- was stoned to death when Rehoboam sent him to the Israelites
- 11.56 Rehoboam turned back from his attack on Israel because prophet --- told him that God disapproved of his intension
- 11.57 ---- made bull-calves of gold for his people to worship because he thought that if they went to worship in Jerusalem, they may transfer their allegiance
- 11.58 ---- told the people of Israel that two gold calves brought them out of Egypt
- 11.59 The hand of king--- became paralysed as he pointed at a prophet from --- who prophesied against the altar he built
- 11.60 As the prophet predicted, the altar with the gold calves in Israel ---
- 11.61 The power of God was demonstrated when the prophet --- and the paralysed arm of the king was restored
- 11.62 The prophet from Judah was deceived by an old prophet from---- who made him disobey God's instructions
- 11.63 The ---- which killed the prophet from Judah and his donkey --- were found standing by his body
- 11.64 King Jeroboam sinned by making ---- from any family and not the Levite family as instructed by God
- 11.65 --- on advice of her husband disguised herself in order to visit a prophet in Shiloh
- 11.66 Jeroboam sent gifts to prophet ---- in order to know from him if his --- who was ill would live
- 11.67 Even though the prophet was blind he identified Jeroboam's wife even before she spoke because --- had told him that she was on her way to him
- 11.68 God's punishment for Jeroboam was that every --- in his family will be killed
- 11.69 God said every member of Jeroboam's family who died in the city will be eaten by --- and all those who die in the open country by ---
- 11.70 The only person who would be properly buried in Jeroboam's family was --- because he pleased God
- 11.71 God was angry with Israel in the time of Jeroboam because they made idols of goddess ---
- 11.72 Rehoboam was --- years old when he became king
- 11.73 Rehoboam ruled for – years in ----
- 11.74 There were male and female prostitutes at the pagan places of --- in Judah
- 11.75 During the reign of Rehoboam, king --- of Egypt attacked Jerusalem and carried away temple treasures.
- 11.76 Rehoboam replaced gold treasures removed from the temple with --- ones
- 11.77 Abijah became king of Judah in the --- year of the reign of Jeroboam in Israel
- 11.78 King ----'s grandmother was the daughter of Absalom
- 11.79 King Asa removed his grandmother, --- from the post of queen mother because she made an idol of Asherah
- 11.80 King --- got rid of male and female temple prostitutes
- 11.81 King Asa placed in the temple gold and ---- objects made by him
- 11.82 King Asa of Judah and king --- of Israel were constantly at war
- 11.83 King --- of Judah was crippled by a foot disease in his old age
- 11.84 King --- sinned against God like his father Jeroboam and ruled Israel for – years

- 11.85 God sent prophet --- to king Baasha to let him know that like the family of ---, members of his family will be eaten by dogs and vultures
- 11.86 King ---, son of Baasha ruled for --- years
- 11.87 --- was assassinated by one of his officers while he was ---
- 11.88 --- became king after assassinating a drunk king
- 11.89 Zimri killed all the members of the family of king ----
- 11.90 Zimri ruled for only a period of --- because Israelite troops hearing how he assassinated the king laid a siege on him.
- 11.91 Zimri died in the --- which he himself started in the palace
- 11.92 The troops proclaimed their commander Omri king but the people were divided on making him or --- king
- 11.93 Omri ruled in the --- year of the rule of Asa in Israel
- 11.94 God was --- with king Omri
- 11.95 King Ahab married --- daughter of ---
- 11.96 Prophet --- told Ahab that there will be no dew or rain for the next ---- or --- years until he said so
- 11.97 God told Elijah to go and hide by the brook of ---
- 11.98 Elijah had water from the brook and food brought to him by ---
- 11.99 Elijah asked the widow of --- to bring him bread from her last flour and oil
- 11.100 A widow had faith that her --- and --- will never finish if she fed a prophet her last meal
- 11.101 The widow believed that Elijah was a man of God when he ----
- 11.102 When Jezebel was killing the prophets of God, ---- hid 100 of the in caves
- 11.103 --- called prophet Elijah the worst troublemaker in Israel
- 11.104 Elijah challenged --- prophets of Baal and --- prophets of Asherah to prove the power of their gods
- 11.105 God answered Elijah's prayer by sending fire down on his sacrifice at Mount ---
- 11.106 Elijah killed all the prophets of Baal by river ---
- 11.107 Elijah prayed with his head bowed between his ---
- 11.108 Elijah's servant did not see a cloud forming until the --- time of checking while Elijah prayed
- 11.109 When the power of God came over Elijah, he ran faster than a ---
- 11.110 Elijah was afraid and fled because --- swore to kill him
- 11.111 Elijah was fed twice by --- while he fled from Jezebel
- 11.112 The food Elijah ate while fleeing from Jezebel gave him strength to run for --- days
- 11.113 God told Elijah to anoint --- prophet after himself
- 11.114 ---- said to prophet Elijah "let me kiss my father and mother goodbye and then I will come with you"
- 11.115 The --- said God was a god of the hills and not of the plains
- 11.116 King Ahab, on the advice of his wife got --- killed to have his vineyard
- 11.117 Ahab hated prophet --- because he always prophesied something bad for him
- 11.118 Prophet --- slapped a prophet because he prophesied doom for Ahab's army
- 11.119 --- licked the blood of --- as the chariot was being washed at the pool of Samaria
- 11.120 In the 17th year of the reign of --- who built ocean-going ships that never sailed, Ahazia became king of Israel



12 2KINGS

- 12.1 King --- fell of the balcony of the roof of his palace in Samaria
- 12.2 Instead of consulting God, king Ahazia sent messengers to consult ---
- 12.3 Elijah went about wearing a cloak made of --- tied with a ---- belt
- 12.4 Rather than follow messengers from a king who believed in Baalzebub, Elijah proved that that he was a man of God by asking for --- to consume them
- 12.5 ---- swore that he will never leave Elijah
- 12.6 Elijah parted the river ---- with his ----
- 12.7 Elisha asked for a --- portion of the spirit of Elijah
- 12.8 Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind riding a -----
- 12.9 Elisha called prophet Elijah ----
- 12.10 Prophet Elisha used the ---- of Elijah to part river Jordan
- 12.11 Elisha cured the water of Jericho with ----
- 12.12 The children who mocked Elisha in Bethel were killed by ---
- 12.13 The ---- came on Elisha when a musician played the harp

- 12.14 A widow told Elisha that her late husband's creditor wanted to take her two --- as slaves
- 12.15 To pay back a creditor, Elihsa helped a widow by the miracle of little ---- which continued to flow and filled several containers
- 12.16 The rich woman of Shunem who used to take care of Elisha had no ---
- 12.17 The ---- woman's son was raised from death by Elisha
- 12.18 Naaman was a commander of the --- army
- 12.19 Elisha sent word to Naaman to go and wash himself ---- times in river---
- 12.20 Elisha's servant --- became --- because he lied to Naaman to collect gifts Elisha had not accepted
- 12.21 Elisha threw a stick into water and a lost --- floated
- 12.22 The officers of an upset Syrian king told him that ---- tells the king of Israel, his enemy what he (Syrian king) does even in his bedroom
- 12.23 Elisha's servant was afraid when he saw the large army after him and Elisha but the Lord opened his eyes to see horses and --- all round Elisha to protect him
- 12.24 Elisha prayed that the Lord should make the enemy army --- and it happened
- 12.25 Elisha deceived a blind army and led them to the enemy town of ---
- 12.26 King --- of Syria led his entire army to lay siege on Samaria until there was food shortage in the town
- 12.27 The food shortage in Samaria, during the siege was so terrible that two women ate one of their ---
- 12.28 The --- of the king of Samaria disbelieved Elisha's prophesy that food will be extremely cheap in the town by the next day and did not --- of the food.
- 12.29 The first people to know of the defeat of the Syrian army were ---
- 12.30 Jehu ordered that --- be thrown down the window and he rode his chariot over her body which dogs ate as prophesied by ---
- 12.31 On receipt of a letter from Jehu, a total of --- sons, descendants of king --- were killed by Samarian leaders
- 12.32 A total of -- relatives of king --- on their way to pay respects to the children of a queen were killed by Jehu's men
- 12.33 --- wiped out the worship of Baal in Israel but like king Jeroboam, made Israel worship gold bull-calves
- 12.34 Queen --- as soon as she heard that her son was dead gave orders for all the members of the royal family to be killed
- 12.35 A young member of a royal family --- was rescued from killers of a queen by his aunt --- who was king Ahazia's half-sister
- 12.36 In the seventh year of Athaliah's reign, priest --- showed the palace officials king Ahaziah's son --- to be anointed and proclaimed as King.
- 12.37 When Athaliah heard the noise of the people as they shouted "long live the king", she shouted --- ---
- 12.38 King --- of --- pleased the Lord because he was instructed by priest Jehoiada
- 12.39 ---- made and placed by the altar a box with a hole in the lid through which the priests put money contributed by worshippers in the temple
- 12.40 King Joash's --- plotted against him and killed him
- 12.41 When Elisha fell ill, king --- of --- visited him and wept, saying "my father, my father"

- 12.42 The corpse that was thrown into Elisha's tomb came back to life as soon as it touched Elisha's ---
- 12.43 King ---, as soon as he came into power executed all the officials who killed his father but not their ---
- 12.44 King --- suffered from a skin disease, so he lived in his own house while his son ruled in the palace
- 12.45 Shallum, son of Jabesh conspired against king --- and assassinated him
- 12.46 King --- of Israel ruled for only one month
- 12.47 ---- assassinated king Shallum and succeeded him as king
- 12.48 King --- of Judah sacrificed his own sons as burnt offerings to idols
- 12.49 Judah never had another king like ---
- 12.50 When the Assyrian emperor sent word to king Hezekiah insulting the Lord, he sought the Lord's assistance through prophet ---
- 12.51 Assyrian emperor Senacherib was worshipping in his temple when two of his --- killed him
- 12.52 King Hezekiah was sick and dying but pleaded for an extension of his life and God granted him --- more years
- 12.53 Hezekiah's choice of a sign from God was for the shadow on the stairway to go – ten steps
- 12.54 ---- whose mother was Hephzibah was twelve years old when he became the king of Judah
- 12.55 ---- not only assassinated a king but ripped open the bellies of pregnant women in a city that did not surrender to him
- 12.56 The king of Judah --- killed so many innocent people that the streets of Jerusalem were said to be flowing with blood
- 12.57 --- was eight years old when he became king of Judah
- 12.58 The mother of the very young king of Judah who succeeded his father, king Amon and who pleased the Lord was ----
- 12.59 When the book of the Law was discovered during Josiah's reign, --- read it out
- 12.60 King --- did away with pagan worship after the book of the Law was discovered and read to him
- 12.61 Tombs in the place of worship built by Jeroboam were destroyed by king Josiah but he preserved the bones of two --- one of whom had predicted what Josiah did
- 12.62 The Passover was celebrated in Jerusalem in the --- year of Josiah's reign
- 12.63 King Josiah was killed when he went to war against invading --- army
- 12.64 King --- of Judah ruled for the shortest period of only --- months
- 12.65 When Jehoiakim was king of Judah, king --- of Babylon invaded Jerusalem as predicted by prophets earlier
- 12.66 Joash's mother was Hamutal, the daughter of ---
- 12.67 It was during the reign of king --- that the king, all treasures of the temple in Jerusalem and all but the poorest people were carried off to Babylon
- 12.68 Nebuchadnezzar took away from Jerusalem --- important men and --- skilled workers
- 12.69 Jehoiakim's uncle --- was made king over Judah by Nebuchadnezzar and his name changed to ---
- 12.70 While --- was watching, Nebuchadnezzar killed all his sons.

- 12.71 The --- army never marched out again when the king of Babylon controlled all the territory belonging to it
- 12.72 Zedekiah rebelled against ---
- 12.73 From the 9th to the 11th year of the reign of Zedekiah, Jerusalem was under ---
- 12.74 During the siege of Jerusalem, the people got so hungry that they broke down the --- ---
- 12.75 When king Zedekiah was captured, his soldiers --- him
- 12.76 ---- was the adviser of Nebuchadnezzar sent to destroy Jerusalem
- 12.77 Part of the punishment for Zedekiah was that his --- were put out
- 12.78 --- put the poorest people left in Jerusalem to work in vineyards and fields
- 12.79 The Babylonians took away gold, silver and bronze columns and objects which king --- had made for the temple in Jerusalem
- 12.80 --- the high priest and --- who was next in rank were taken captives by Babylonians
- 12.81 The priests, king's personal advisers and important temple officials of Judah were beaten and --- by the Babylonian king
- 12.82 The Babylonian king carried the people of Judah into ---
- 12.83 ---- was made --- in charge of those who were left in Jerusalem
- 12.84 ---- a member of the royal family killed the man put in charge of those left in Jerusalem
- 12.85 King ---- of Babylon released Jehoiachim from prison
- 12.86 Jehoiachim was given more honour than other --- who were on exile with him
- 12.87 Jehoiachim changed from --- clothes to dine with the king of Babylon
- 12.88 Each day, for as long as he lived in Babylon, Jehoiachim received --- from the king of Babylon
- 12.89 Mercy was shown to Jehoiakim the --- year after he had been taken as prisoner
- 12.90 King --- was the king of Judah who read aloud to the people the whole book of the covenant discovered in the temple in Jerusalem



13 *1*CHRONICLES

- 13.1 ---- was the father of Methuselah
- 13.2 ---- the grandson of Methuselah had 3 sons, Shem, Ham and Japheth
- 13.3 The sons of Ham were Cush, Egypt (Mizraim), Libya (Put) and ---
- 13.4 The descendants of Cush were ----, Havilah, Sabtah, Raamah, and Sabteca
- 13.5 ---- had a son called Nimrod who became mighty (the world's first great conqueror)
- 13.6 The firstborn of Canaan was ----
- 13.7 The Jebusites are descendants of ---
- 13.8 One of the two sons of Eber was named --- because in his days, the earth was divided
- 13.9 Terah was the father of ---
- 13.10 Abraham's concubine --- had a grandson named Sheba
- 13.11 One of the sons of --- was Korah
- 13.12 Timna was one of the sons of ----
- 13.13 The first king of Edom before any king reigned over Israel was ---
- 13.14 After king Hadad, the rulers (kings) of Edom were called ---
- 13.15 Timna was one of the rulers of ---
- 13.16 The first son of Israel was ---
- 13.17 --- was the grandfather of Nahshon, who was the grandfather of Boaz
- 13.18 --- was the father of Boaz and grandfather of Obed born by Ruth
- 13.19 ---- was the 7th son of Jesse
- 13.20 Jesse's second daughter --- married an Ishmaelite
- 13.21 Zaza was one of the sons of ----
- 13.22 David's second son was --- born to him by Abigail

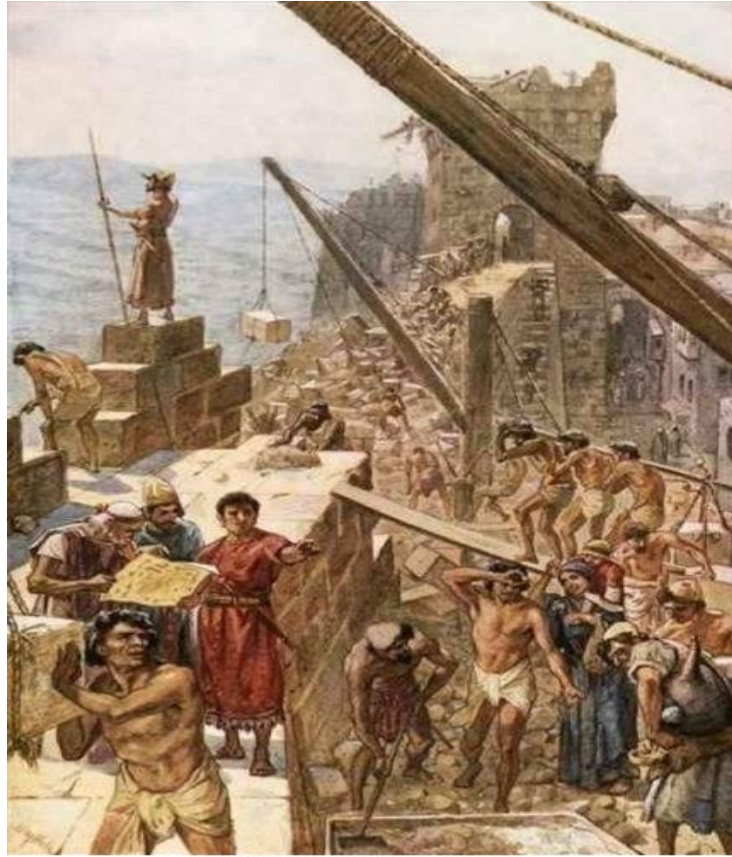
- 13.23 Iru was the first and one of the 3 sons of ---
- 13.24 Altogether, --- sons were born to David in Hebron by --- women
- 13.25 David ruled in --- for 33 years
- 13.26 A man who was the most respected in his family was named --- because his birth had been very painful
- 13.27 Jabez prayed for a change of his destiny by asking God to expand his --- and keep him from any evil that will cause him---
- 13.28 Reuben lost his birthright as first son of Jacob to ---
- 13.29 In Jacob's family, it was the tribe of --- that became the strongest and provided rulers for all the tribes
- 13.30 Gog, Micah and Baal were descendants of ---
- 13.31 Aaron, Moses and Miriam were children of the same father, ---
- 13.32 The elder son of Samuel was ---
- 13.33 The descendants of --- received the first portion of the land of Levites including Hebron and surrounding pasturelands
- 13.34 One of Tola's sons Uzzi had only one son named ----
- 13.35 Joshua's grandfather was ---- and his father was Nun
- 13.36 The descendants of --- were Naaman, Ahijah and Gerah
- 13.37 The people of --- were taken to Babylon as a result of their sins
- 13.38 After return from Babylon the total number of temple guards who lived in Jerusalem was ---
- 13.39 When Jerusalem was still known as Jebus, David said the first person to kill a --- will be commander of his army
- 13.40 When David's enemies, the Philistines occupied Bethlehem, he was so home sick that he wanted a drink of water from the ---
- 13.41 Many ---- went to join David in Hebron to make him king in place of Saul
- 13.42 The Covenant Box which had been captured was brought from --- by David and the people of Israel
- 13.43 God told David to attack the Philistines only when he heard the sound of marching on ----
- 13.44 It was the --- who carried the Covenant Box
- 13.45 King David put --- as the brothers in charge of the Covenant Box
- 13.46 God's decision that one of David's sons would build the Temple was revealed to -- - in a ---
- 13.47 David told Solomon that God would not let him build the Temple because he had ---
- 13.48 The leaders of the Levites drew lots against their --- for their assignments
- 13.49 ---- and his brothers were put in charge of everything dedicated for use in the Temple
- 13.50 After David had provided the materials for building the Temple, he asked for anyone else who was willing to dedicate his --- to the Lord



14 2CHRONICLES

- 14.1 King Solomon started construction of the Temple in the -- year of his reign
- 14.2 King Solomon made a --- with decorations in the shape of bulls
- 14.3 The tank of the Temple rested on --- bulls (oxen)
- 14.4 The bronze tank in the temple could hold up to --- of water
- 14.5 When the cloud with the dazzling light of the Lord filled the Temple, the priests could not continue to ---
- 14.6 When people repent of their sins and turn to God, he will --- their land
- 14.7 David moved his wife, ----'s daughter from Egypt to another house because she could not live where the Covenant Box had been
- 14.8 Rehoboam told his subjects that his little --- was fatter than his father's waist
- 14.9 The history of king Abijah is recorded in the book of prophet ---
- 14.10 Azaria told king Asa that for a long time Israel had no --- to teach and no law
- 14.11 Prophet hanani told king Asa that he would lose the army of Israel because he put his trust in the king of --- and not in the Lord
- 14.12 When king Ahab wanted to know if he should attack Ramoth, a spirit volunteered to go and make all Ahab's prophets tell ---
- 14.13 King --- who went to war along with king Jehoshaphat disguised himself
- 14.14 The enemies thought --- was the king of Israel and pursued him
- 14.15 When Amariah was High Priest, Zebadiah son of --- was governor of Judah
- 14.16 The Spirit of the Lord came upon --- son of Zechariah and he told king Jehoshaphat and the people that the Lord would fight their battle against ---
- 14.17 God threw an invading army into panic when the people of Judah started ---
- 14.18 King Jehoshaphat and his people spent --- days gathering loot from a defeated Edomite army
- 14.19 The deeds of King Jehoshaphat are recorded in the book of ---, son of Hanani
- 14.20 King Jehoram followed the wicked example of king --- whose daughter he married
- 14.21 Prophet --- wrote a letter condemning king Jehoram's leadership
- 14.22 King Jehoram was inflicted with a disease of the ---
- 14.23 When king Jehoram died, his subjects did not make a --- in mourning for him and did not bury him in the --- for kings.

- 14.24 When Jehoidah was taken from the temple to the palace the people rejoiced and the city was quiet because --- had been killed
- 14.25 When king Amaziah was going to war with Edom he was warned not to take with him soldiers from ---
- 14.26 Amazia and the people of Judah took ten thousand of their enemies to the --- and threw them down, breaking them to pieces
- 14.27 King Uzziah who wrongly burnt incense at the altar was inflicted with --- and his son ruled in the palace in his stead
- 14.28 The deeds of king Uzziah are recorded in the book by prophet ---
- 14.29 King Jotham's mother was ---, the daughter of zadok
- 14.30 King --- made molten images of Baal and sacrificed his own sons as burnt offerings
- 14.31 When Israel captured people from Judah, prophet --- warned them against God's anger for taking their own brothers and sisters prisoners
- 14.32 King --- took gold from the temple and palace to give the emperor of Assyria who still did not help him
- 14.33 King Ahaz was buried in ---- and not in the royal tombs
- 14.34 King --- did what was pleasing to the Lord and in the first month of his reign repaired the gates of the Temple
- 14.35 Among the serving Levites in the time of king Hezekiah was --- the son of Joah
- 14.36 Everything that was ritually unclean was removed from the Temple in the time of Hezekiah and taken to the valley (brook) of ---
- 14.37 The celebration of king --- and the people brought so much joy, the type that had not happened since the time of king Solomon
- 14.38 When the Assyrians insulted God, king --- and prophet --- prayed and the Assyrian army was killed by an angel sent by God
- 14.39 King Manasseh's evil deeds and the idols he worshipped are recorded in the books of the ---
- 14.40 King Josiah in the --- year of his reign celebrated the Passover in a way it had not been done since the time of prophet ---
- 14.41 Instead of heeding God's warning through king Neco, king Josiah --- disguised himself and went to war and was killed by --- arrows
- 14.42 ---- composed a lament for king Josiah
- 14.43 The deeds of king Josiah are spoken of by singing men and women in ---
- 14.44 King---- of --- made king Joahaz of Judah prisoner and made his brother king instead
- 14.45 When the Babylonian king attacked Jerusalem in the time of Zedekiah, Jerusalem was completely ---
- 14.46 The people of Judah were prisoners and slaves in Babylon until the rise of the ----
- 14.47 The captivity of the people of Judah was for --- years to make up for ---- not observed.
- 14.48 The period of captivity of Judah was a fulfillment of prophesy of --- that their land will be barren.
- 14.49 Cyrus king of Persia said god asked him to build a temple in ----
- 14.50 King --- of ---- believed that all the kingdoms on earth had been given him by God

15 EZRA

- 15.1 Through Cyrus, the emperor of ---, the Lord made Jeremiah's prophecy come true
- 15.2 --- thought he was the ruler of the whole world and had the mandate to build the Temple in ---
- 15.3 To assist the Jewish exiles who were returning to Jerusalem, Cyrus commanded that their neighbours should give them ---, ---, ---- and offerings
- 15.4 Cyrus gave back to the Jews the utensils king --- had put in the temple of his gods
- 15.5 An inventory of items returned from Babylon to Jerusalem was given to ----, the governor of Judah
- 15.6 The 11 leaders of the returning Jewish exiles were Z---, J---, N---, S---, R---, M---, B---, M---, B---, R---, and B---.
- 15.7 The largest number of returning Jewish exiles were from ---.
- 15.8 Ami was one of the clan of ---'s servants who returned from exile in Babylon

- 15.9 There were a total of --- people of different clans who returned from exile but who could not prove that they were Israelites
- 15.10 Some priestly clans among the exiles could not prove their ancestry and were therefore not accepted as ---
- 15.11 The total number of Jewish exiles who returned to Jerusalem was ---
- 15.12 The Temple --- was built on its old site
- 15.13 All Levites --- years of age or older were put in charge of building the temple
- 15.14 When builders began to lay the foundation of the Temple, the people ---
- 15.15 While others shouted for joy as the foundation of the Temple was laid, older ---, Levites and heads of --- cried and wailed
- 15.16 The people who had been sent to live in the land of the Jews by the Assyrian emperor --- tried to discourage the Jews from ---
- 15.17 Letters of opposition to the building of the Temple were written during the reigns of --- and ---
- 15.18 Those who opposed rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem called Jerusalem a --- and --- city
- 15.19 --- issued an order for the rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem to stop
- 15.20 Prophets --- and --- spoke in the name of the Lord leading to recommencement of the rebuilding of the --- in Jerusalem
- 15.21 The scroll found in the city of --- had instruction from Cyrus that the Temple should be rebuilt
- 15.22 ---, emperor of Persia ordered Tattenai, the governor of West Euphrates and fellow officials to stay away from the temple and not interfere with the rebuilding
- 15.23 In order for the Jews to pray for – and his ---, he ordered those opposing the Jews to pay their expenses for rebuilding the Temple
- 15.24 The rebuilding of the Temple was completed in the --- year of the reign of Darius
- 15.25 The dedication of the Temple rebuilt in Jerusalem was according to the instructions of ---
- 15.26 The second group of exiles who left Babylon for Jerusalem was led by --- who traced his ancestry to Aaron
- 15.27 --- was a priest and scholar who had a thorough knowledge of the laws of the Lord and taught them
- 15.28 --- gave instructions that anyone connected with the rebuilding of the Temple should not be made to pay tax
- 15.29 Ezra was given instructions to appoint --- and --- over all in West Euphrates who lived by the law of his God
- 15.30 Ezra was to teach the law of --- and anyone who disobeyed it or the law of the --- was to be punished
- 15.31 Among the exiles that followed Ezra were priests but no --- for the Temple
- 15.32 On request for those to serve in the temple --- sent Sherebiah from Babylon
- 15.33 Sherebiah left Babylon to serve in the Temple in Jerusalem with --- sons and brothers
- 15.34 Rather than ask the emperor for troops to protect the exiles on their journey, Ezra gave orders for all to ---
- 15.35 When Ezra returned to Jerusalem the Temple priest was ---, son of Uriah

- 15.36 When Ezra and his group went to present gifts and offerings at the temple, --- son of Phinehas was with the priest
- 15.37 To appease God's anger concerning intermarriage of Jews with non-Jews, --- suggested that all foreign women and their --- be sent away
- 15.38 The only person among the Jews who disagreed with the plan to send away foreign wives were --- , son of Asahel and --- and two Levites
- 15.39 Judah and Eliezer were among the --- who had foreign wives
- 15.40 Eliezer and Gedaliah were --- who had to send away their foreign wives and children
- 15.41 King --- had never seen Nehemiah looking sad until the day he requested to go to Jerusalem



16 *NEHEMIAH*

- 16.1 Nehemiah was in Susa when his brother --- arrived from Judah with a group
16.2 --- wept because he was told that the Jews were in reproach and the walls of ---
were still broken and the gates ---
16.3 Nehemiah was a --- to the Persian emperor ---
16.4 Before telling the emperor his request, Nehemiah ---
16.5 --- had never seen Nehemiah looking so sad before the day he requested to go to

16.6 The emperor of Persia not only granted Nehemiah's request to go to Jerusalem
but also sent with him some --- and a troop of horsemen
16.7 --- and --- were highly indignant when they heard that someone had come to work
for the good of the people of Israel
16.8 Nehemiah got up in the middle of --- to inspect the broken walls of Jerusalem
16.9 Priest --- and his fellow priests rebuilt the Sheep gate
16.10 The clan of Hasenaah built the --- gate
16.11 Sanballat, Tobia and Geshem, the Arab laughed at the Jews' attempt to rebuild the
wall of Jerusalem
16.12 --- thought the wall built by the Jews would be so weak that even a --- going up
would break it
16.13 Half the Jews worked while half --- because of the plans of the plans of enemies
to disrupt the rebuilding of the wall of Jerusalem

- 16.14 Those who worked on the wall or brought materials worked with one hand and carried a --- in the other
- 16.15 ---- and the workers stayed in Jerusalem to guard it at night
- 16.16 Those who worked on the walls of Jerusalem never took off their --- and --- even at night
- 16.17 Nehemiah called a general assembly to deal with the problem of --- of the poor
- 16.18 Even though a governor, ---- did not claim the food allowances he was entitled to
- 16.19 Sambalt, Tobiah and Geshem wanted to harm Nehemiah and asked him to meet them by the Plain of ---
- 16.20 Shemaiah was bribed to pretend that he cared about Nehemiah's and was to suggest that Nehemiah should hide in --- of the temple
- 16.21 ---, a woman was one of those who tried to frighten Nehemiah
- 16.22 Rebuilding of the entire wall of Jerusalem was completed in --- days in spite of aggressive opposition
- 16.23 Nehemiah appointed --- and --- to govern the city of Jerusalem
- 16.24 The gate of Jerusalem was not opened before --- and was closed before the guards went off duty at ---
- 16.25 Ezra was the --- when Nehemiah was governor
- 16.26 For the first time since the time of Joshua, the Israelites lived in temporary shelters to celebrate the Festival of ---
- 16.27 During the Israelites' confession of their sins the --- prayed aloud
- 16.28 --- was the second person to sign the agreement made by the Israelites to keep God's laws
- 16.29 Those who lived in Jerusalem were the --- and one out of every --- families
- 16.30 The supervisor of the Levites who lived in Jerusalem was ---
- 16.31 Of the exiles who returned to Jerusalem, the people of the clan of --- lived in Ai
- 16.32 The city wall of Jerusalem was dedicated with --- and sacrifices
- 16.33 The Ammonites and Moabites were not permitted to join or mix with the Israelites because they did not give --- and --- to the Israelites when on their way out of Egypt
- 16.34 The Ammonites and Moabites gave money to --- to curse the people of Israel
- 16.35 --- the priest in charge of the --- in Jerusalem was on good terms with Tobiah
- 16.36 ---- was shocked on his return to Jerusalem to see that the priest had allowed Tobiah to use one of the rooms in the Temple
- 16.37 The temple --- went back to their farmlands because the people did not give them enough allowances
- 16.38 --- asked god to remember and credit him for what he had done for the people, the Temple and its worship
- 16.39 Nehemiah gave instructions for the gates of Jerusalem to be shut at the beginning of --- because the people did not keep it holy
- 16.40 Nehemiah punished men who intermarried and reminded them of the fact that it was foreign women who made king --- fall



17 ESTHER

- 17.1 --- was the capital of Persia
- 17.2 From the capital of Persia, king Xerxes ruled from India to ---
- 17.3 While king Xerxes had a banquet in his palace gardens, Queen --- had one for women --- the palace
- 17.4 King Xerxes showed off the riches of his palace for --- months
- 17.5 On the --- day of his banquet for his officials, king Xerxes wanted to show off his wife's ---
- 17.6 For refusing to obey the king's order, ---, one of the king's officials suggested that she be removed as queen
- 17.7 --- was the eunuch in charge of king Xerxes' women in the harem
- 17.8 ---, a relation of Esther was among the --- from Jerusalem in king Jehoiachin's time
- 17.9 Esther's Hebrew name was ---
- 17.10 Shaashgas was the eunuch in charge of king Xerxes' ---
- 17.11 Beautiful women from all over Persia had beauty treatment for --- before appearing for king Xerxes' approval
- 17.12 Esther did not reveal the fact that she was --- to anyone in the palace
- 17.13 Mordecai revealed to Esther the plot by --- and --- to assassinate king Xerxes
- 17.14 --- planned to kill all Jews in Persia because Mordecai refused to kneel and bow down to him
- 17.15 ---, the eunuch appointed as ---'s servant was the one Mordecai told of the proclamation to kill all Jews in Persia
- 17.16 In Persia, a person who goes into the inner courtyard without being summoned by the king must ---
- 17.17 --- sent word to Esther saying "maybe it was for a time like this that you were made queen"

- 17.18 Esther --- for 3 days before going to see king Xerxes who had not called for her
- 17.19 Esther found so much favour with king Xerxes that he was willing to give her ---
- 17.20 Esther invited king Xerxes and --- to her --- on two successive days
- 17.21 Haman's --- and --- suggested that he should build a gallows to hand Mordecai
- 17.22 The same night that Haman was planning to seek king Xerxes' permission to hang ---, the king was thinking of how to honour him
- 17.23 Haman had to lead --- dressed in a royal robe, through the city square, riding the king's horse
- 17.24 As --- threw himself down on Esther's couch to beg for his life, the king thought he wanted to --- her
- 17.25 --- told king Xerxes about the gallows Haman had built to hand Mordecai
- 17.26 After hanging Haman the king gave all his properties to ---
- 17.27 Since a proclamation issued in the king's name and stamped with his --- cannot be revoked, Mordecai had to write letters to Jews on self----
- 17.28 Of the --- people killed in Susa by the Jews, 10 were sons of ---
- 17.29 Altogether, the Jews killed --- of their enemies in Persia in the month of ---
- 17.30 The festival of --- is celebrated in remembrance of of the Jews' victory over their enemies in Persia



18 JOB

- 18.1 Job lived in the land of ---
- 18.2 Job was the richest man in the ---
- 18.3 Job's --- sons used to take turns to give a feast for each other and their --- sisters
- 18.4 --- told God that he had been roaming around the earth
- 18.5 God described – as the most faithful and good man on earth
- 18.6 On the same day, Job's --- and--- were stolen, lightning struck the sheep and the shepherds and --- were stolen by Chaldeans
- 18.7 All the --- children of Job were killed by a --- from the desert
- 18.8 In grief, Job said “” I was born with --- and I will die with ---“
- 18.9 When he lost all his possessions and children, Job --- the Lord
- 18.10 Satan thought Job will not be faithful to God if he hurt his ---
- 18.11 Job's wife advised him to --- God and die
- 18.12 Job's 3 friends were ----, --- and ---
- 18.13 Job's friends sat grieving with him without saying a word for --- days and nights
- 18.14 Job in anguish cursed ---
- 18.15 Job preferred to have died in his --- or be --- instead of living
- 18.16 The first to speak among Job's friends was---
- 18.17 --- reminded Job of the saying “happy is the man whom God corrects”
- 18.18 Job thought that his grief and trouble would weigh more than ---
- 18.19 Job told Eliphaz that his friendship was like that of a deceitful ---
- 18.20 When job tried to sleep, he had --- and ---
- 18.21 Bildad thought Job's response to Eliphaz was like strong ---

- 18.22 --- thought Job's suffering and the death of his children was due to sin
- 18.23 If God were --- like Job, then Job would take him to court
- 18.24 Job reminded God of the fact that He --- him but was now harming him
- 18.25 ---- thought that Job's multitude of words were lies (nonsense)
- 18.26 --- thought Job was receiving less punishment from God than he deserved
- 18.27 Job expressed his faith in God to --- by saying "though He slay me, yet I will – in Him"
- 18.28 Eliphaz thought Job was condemned by his own ---
- 18.29 Eliphaz reminded Job that those who trust in evil are the ones who will have --- as their reward
- 18.30 Job did not think his --- were comforting him, instead he felt ---
- 18.31 Job said he will call the worm eating him his --- and ---
- 18.32 Job believed even though deserted by earthly people, the Lord (his redeemer) will --- him
- 18.33 Bildad said that God is powerful and keeps His heavenly kingdom in ---
- 18.34 Job said he will insist on his innocence (integrity) until his ---
- 18.35 Wisdom is worth more than gold or any ---
- 18.36 Only --- knows where wisdom can be found
- 18.37 A by-stander, --- was angry that Job was justifying himself
- 18.38 A young man from the clan of --- told Job that he was only waiting for the --- people to speak but he did not think it was growing old that made people wise
- 18.39 God answered Job out of a ---
- 18.40 Job had to offer sacrifices for his --- who made God angry and God --- him even more than before



19 *PSALMS*

- 19.1 Those who do not follow the examples of sinners and --- the advice of evil men are ---
- 19.2 Those who obey the Law of God are like trees planted by the ---, having --- all the time and bearing --- at the right time
- 19.3 Evil people are like --- that the wind blows away
- 19.4 God installs his king on the sacred hill in ---
- 19.5 Kings and rulers of the earth who serve the Lord with --- are the ones who will rejoice
- 19.6 Those who --- are protected from their enemies
- 19.7 Offering the --- and trusting the Lord brings more happiness than asking God for more blessings
- 19.8 God does not like the site of proud or --- people
- 19.9 The Psalmist says no one remembers or praises God in ----
- 19.10 God is a --- judge
- 19.11 God appointed --- ruler over all He created
- 19.12 The Lord is a --- for the oppressed
- 19.13 The wicked in their --- think god does not matter and do not seek after God
- 19.14 According to the psalmist, the Lord is in His --- and His --- is in heaven
- 19.15 The word (promises) of God are as pure (genuine) as --- refined --- times
- 19.16 The Lord looks down on men from heaven to see those who have --- and --- Him
- 19.17 Those who may worship in the --- or on God's holy hill are those who --- Him
- 19.18 God shows the path of ---
- 19.19 God is --- to those who are merciful and faithful to those who are ---
- 19.20 The law of the Lord is ---
- 19.21 Some trust in chariots, others in --- but we trust in the Lord our God
- 19.22 The Lord is my --- I shall not want (lack anything)
- 19.23 Goodness and --- shall follow me all the days of my life
- 19.24 God leads the --- in the right way
- 19.25 The Lord is my light and my ---, I will fear no one

- 19.26 The --- of the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon
- 19.27 There may be --- in the night but joy comes in the morning
- 19.28 Blessed (happy) are those whose sins are ---
- 19.29 Even --- go hungry for lack of food but those who obey (seek) the Lord lack nothing ---
- 19.30 There is no one like ---; He protects the weak from the --- and the poor from the oppressor
- 19.31 God's --- reaches the heavens and His faithfulness reaches the ---
- 19.32 The psalmist said in his old age he had never seen the --- people abandoned by God or their --- begging for food (bread)
- 19.33 God can pull us out of dangerous pits or miry clay and set us safely on ---
- 19.34 God prefers for us to --- him than for us to give offerings and sacrifices
- 19.35 The psalmist's ---, even the one he trusted and shared his food with turned against him
- 19.36 Those who trust in themselves and --- will perish like sheep
- 19.37 Giving --- is the sacrifice that glorifies (honours) God
- 19.38 The --- says to himself "there is no God"
- 19.39 Ephraim is God's helmet and Judah His ---
- 19.40 God cares for orphans (the fatherless) and protects the ---
- 19.41 The --- predicted that the people of Cush (Ethiopia) will submit (raise their hands in praise) to God
- 19.42 The psalmist cried to God for help because when he was hungry, he was given --- and when thirsty, he was given ---
- 19.43 One day spent in the house of God is better than a --- spent anywhere else
- 19.44 According to the psalmist, man's time on earth is --- and --- for strong ones
- 19.45 Whoever goes to the Lord for safety (who abides in the shadow of the Almighty) will see a --- fall by his side and --- all around (by the right hand) but he will not be harmed
- 19.46 As high as the sky (heaven) is above the earth, so great is God's --- for those who honour (fear) Him
- 19.47 The Lord made a solemn promise "you will be a Priest forever in the priestly order of ----"
- 19.48 The psalmist proclaimed "praise the Lord all ---, praise Him all ---"
- 19.49 I shall not die, but --- and proclaim the --- of the Lord
- 19.50 Your word is a lamp to my --- and light unto my ---
- 19.51 Except --- builds the house, the work of the builders is useless (in vain)
- 19.52 Children are a --- of the Lord
- 19.53 How wonderful it is, how --- for god's people to live together in ---
- 19.54 Raise your --- in prayer in the Temple and praise the Lord
- 19.55 God's --- is eternal (endures forever)
- 19.56 God decided the number of --- and calls each one by name
- 19.57 God raises the --- but crushes the --- to the ground
- 19.58 God's pleasure is not in --- or --- but in those who honour (fear) him and trust His constant love
- 19.59 At God's --- all things on earth and in heaven were created. They should all --- Him

19.60 All --- instruments should be used in praising God



20 *PROVERBS*

- 20.1 The proverbs are wise sayings of ---
- 20.2 To have knowledge one must first have --- for the Lord
- 20.3 When --- tempt you, do not consent
- 20.4 It does no good to spread a net when the --- you want to catch is watching
- 20.5 The lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come --- and ---
- 20.6 Not thinking you are wiser than you are and obeying the Lord is like ---
- 20.7 The Lord corrects those He ---
- 20.8 Wisdom is more valuable than ---
- 20.9 Never tell your neighbour to wait till --- if you can help him now
- 20.10 The lips of a strange woman (another man's wife) may be as sweet as --- and her kisses as smooth as --- but she will leave you bitterness and pain
- 20.11 Be happy with the woman you --- first (of your youth)
- 20.12 If you promise to be responsible for someone else's --- you are in a trap and must hasten to get ---
- 20.13 Lazy people should learn from the way --- live
- 20.14 A man who commits --- has no sense (understanding). He is just --- himself
- 20.15 Treat wisdom as your ---
- 20.16 Having love affairs with another man's wife is a way (shortcut) to ---
- 20.17 The Lord possessed --- before the world began
- 20.18 If you correct a --- you will only be insulted (shamed)
- 20.19 If you reprimand (correct) --- people, they will respect (love) you
- 20.20 --- gotten by dishonesty will do you no good but honesty can save your life
- 20.21 Hate stirs up --- but love overlooks offences (sins)
- 20.22 Never get a lazy person to do something for you; he will be as irritating as --- on your teeth or --- in your eyes
- 20.23 Beauty in a woman without --- is like a gold ring in a pig's snout

- 20.24 Be generous and you will be ---
- 20.25 A wife who brings shame on her husband is like --- in his bones
- 20.26 When a fool is annoyed he quickly lets it be known; sensible people will --- an insult
- 20.27 A lie has a short life, but truth ---
- 20.28 Hard work will give you power; being lazy will make you a ---
- 20.29 The more easily you get your ---, the sooner you will lose it
- 20.30 Homes are made by the wisdom of ---, but are destroyed by foolishness
- 20.31 People with a hot --- do foolish things
- 20.32 If you want to be ---, be kind to the poor
- 20.33 A witness saves --- when he speaks the truth
- 20.34 Peace of mind makes the body ---, but jealousy is like a ---
- 20.35 --- makes a nation great, sin is a disgrace to a nation
- 20.36 A gentle answer quietens ---, but a harsh one stirs it up
- 20.37 It is better to eat --- with people you love than to eat the finest meat where there is hatred
- 20.38 The fear of the Lord instruction of ---, humility comes before ---
- 20.39 It is better to be --- than powerful; it is better to win control over yourself than over ---
- 20.40 An intelligent person learns more from --- than a fool learns from being beaten a hundred times
- 20.41 The start of an argument is like the first break in a ---; stop it before it goes any further
- 20.42 The name of the Lord is a strong ---, the righteous run to it and they are ---
- 20.43 Your --- can sustain you when you are sick, but if you lose it, your last hope is gone
- 20.44 Death and life are in the power of the ---
- 20.45 A man can inherit a house and money from his parents, but only the Lord can give him a sensible ---
- 20.46 When you give to the poor, it is like ---ing to the Lord and the Lord will pay you back
- 20.47 Drinking too much makes you --- and --- (wine is a ---)
- 20.48 The customer always complains that the price is --- but then he goes off and brags about the --- he got
- 20.49 Do not take it on yourself to repay a wrong. Trust --- and He will make it right
- 20.50 We admire the --- of youth and --- the grey hair of old age
- 20.51 Better to live on the --- than to share a house with a nagging ---
- 20.52 If you have to choose between a good reputation and great wealth, choose ---
- 20.53 The rich and the poor have this in common; the Lord --- them both
- 20.54 Do not be glad when your --- meets disaster, and do not rejoice when they stumble
- 20.55 Without wood, a fire goes out, without --- quarrelling stops
- 20.56 Anger is cruel and destructive but it is nothing compared to ---
- 20.57 Selfish people are in such a hurry to get --- that they do not know when --- is about to strike
- 20.58 People stay in hiding when the --- come to power

- 20.59 There is more --- for a stupid fool than for someone who speaks without thinking
- 20.60 Two things that Argur asked of God before his death are that he should be kept from --- and that he not be --- nor ---
- 20.61 Argur was afraid that if he had more --- than he needed, he might say “---“
- 20.62 Argur feared that if he was poor, he might --- and bring --- on God’s name
- 20.63 The leech has two daughters and both are named “---“
- 20.64 There are 4 things that are never satisfied: the world of the ---, the --- womb, dry --- that needs water and --- out of control
- 20.65 Charm is deceptive and beauty--- but a woman who --- the Lord should be praised





21 ***ECCLESIASTES***

- 21.1 Ecclesiastes Are the words of the philosopher, ---'s son
- 21.2 Generations come and generations go but the --- stays just the same
- 21.3 There is nothing --- in the world
- 21.4 The philosopher says everything done in this world is ---; it is like chasing the ---
- 21.5 The philosopher --- laughter, wine, wealth, ownership of slaves and every other thing that could give pleasure but still considered them ---
- 21.6 Wisdom is better than --- just as light is better than darkness
- 21.7 The philosopher believes that the best thing a person can do is to --- and --- and enjoy what he has earned
- 21.8 Everything that happens in this world happens at the time --- chooses
- 21.9 There is a --- for mourning and a season (time) for ----
- 21.10 A human being is no better than an animal, they are going to the same place, ---
- 21.11 Those who have --- are better than those who have died or who are still alive
- 21.12 Two are better than --- because they can work more effectively
- 21.13 People work hard to succeed because they --- their neighbours
- 21.14 A man may rise from poverty to be king of his country, or go from prison to the throne
- 21.15 It is better to think before you speak and don't make rash --- to God
- 21.16 The more you worry, the more likely you are to have --- dreams
- 21.17 If you --- money, you will never be satisfied
- 21.18 We leave this world just as we entered it, with ---

- 21.19 A good reputation is better than expensive ---; the day you --- is better than the day you are ---
- 21.20 --- is better than laughter; it may sadden your face but it sharpens your ---
- 21.21 If you cheat someone, you are acting like a ---
- 21.22 “Oh, why were things so much --- in the --- days?” is not an intelligent question
- 21.23 Do not pay attention to --- people say, you may hear your servant insulting you
- 21.24 --- makes people smile and their frowns disappear
- 21.25 No one can keep from dying or put off the day of ---
- 21.26 God controls the actions of --- and righteous people, even their --- and hate
- 21.27 A live dog is better than a dead ---
- 21.28 Fast runners do not always ---
- 21.29 Wisdom does more good than ---, but one sinner can undo a lot of good
- 21.30 Dead ---- can make a whole bottle of perfume stink, and a little stupidity can cancel out the greatest wisdom
- 21.31 If your ruler becomes angry with you, do not hand in your resignation; serious wrongs may be --- if you keep calm
- 21.32 Knowing how to charm a snake is of no use if you let the snake ---
- 21.33 Invest your money in --- trade, one of these days you will make a profit
- 21.34 If you wait until the --- and the weather are just right, you will never sow anything
- 21.35 Be grateful for every --- you live
- 21.36 Be happy while you are still ---. Do what you want to do and follow your --- desire
- 21.37 Remember your creator while you are still --- before those --- days and years come
- 21.38 When you are old, your teeth will be too --- to chew your food, your eyes too – to see clearly
- 21.39 In old age, you will be afraid of --- places
- 21.40 The sayings of the wise are like sharp --- that shepherds use to guide sheep



22 ***THE SONG OF SONGS***

- 22.1 The woman in Solomon's Song of songs was --- by the sun
- 22.2 Solomon's love excites men as a mare excites the stallions of ---'s chariots
- 22.3 The man in the Song of Songs is like the wild flowers that bloom in the vineyards of ---
- 22.4 The woman is described as the rose of --- and --- of the valleys
- 22.5 Weakness from passion can be restored with flagons (raisins) and ---
- 22.6 The --- dreams about the --- but cannot find the loved one
- 22.7 When --- is coming from the desert he is like a --- of smoke, fragrant with incense and myrrh
- 22.8 Solomon is carried on his throne (bed) with --- soldiers as body guards
- 22.9 The woman sees king Solomon wearing a crown placed on his head by --- on his wedding day
- 22.10 The woman's neck is like the tower of ---
- 22.11 The woman dreamt that her lover knocked on her door, when she opened he was ---
- 22.12 The --- found the woman and struck her and wounded her
- 22.13 The women of Jerusalem called the woman the --- of all women
- 22.14 The woman claimed her lover to be handsome and strong, one in --- thousands
- 22.15 The woman's hair dances like a flock of --- bouncing down the hill of ---
- 22.16 The king in spite of many queens and concubines loves only this woman who is the --- daughter of her mother
- 22.17 The woman in the Song of Songs is from ---
- 22.18 The woman wished her lover were her ---
- 22.19 Love is as powerful as ---
- 22.20 Solomon had a --- in Baal Hamon



23 *ISAIAH*

- 23.1 Isaiah's father was called ---
- 23.2 Isaiah lived through the reigns of --- kings of Judah
- 23.3 Through Isaiah, God complained about the --- of the children of Israel against him
- 23.4 The rulers of Jerusalem were said to be like those of --- and ---
- 23.5 God said that the sacrifices, the worship and --- --- of the people of Israel were corrupted by their ---
- 23.6 God will not listen to prayers of those whose --- are covered with ----
- 23.7 According to the Lord, Jerusalem which was once faithful was behaving like a ---
- 23.8 Isaiah prophesied that many nations will go to --- where the Lord will teach them
- 23.9 God will punish the women of Jerusalem by --- their heads
- 23.10 Jerusalem is doomed because early in the morning, the people start --- and by evening get ---
- 23.11 Isaiah saw the Lord in the year that king --- died
- 23.12 Isaiah's sins and guilt were removed when his lip was touched with a --- from the ---
- 23.13 Isaiah heard the Lord say "Whom shall I ---, who will --- for us?"
- 23.14 The Lord told Isaiah to "make the minds of the people ---, their ears --- and their eyes blind so that they cannot see or hear or ---
- 23.15 The Lord said that the people of Jerusalem will not turn back to God until their city is ---
- 23.16 God told Isaiah to take his son, ---- along when he went to reassure king --- of Judah to have faith that he will not be defeated by Syria and its ally, Israel
- 23.17 God assured the king of Judah through Isaiah that the threats of king --- of Israel and king --- of Syria were no more dangerous than two smoldering sticks
- 23.18 Isaiah prophesied about the sign of the young woman, a --- who will bear a son and call him "----"

- 23.19 Prophet Isaiah predicted attacks on Jerusalem from Egypt and ---
- 23.20 God told Isaiah to take a large scroll and write on it ---- --- ---
- 23.21 The Lord said that before Isaiah's son could say "mommy and daddy" all the wealth of --- and loot of Samaria would be carried off to Assyria
- 23.22 God warned Isaiah that the people of Judah will want him to consult those with familiar ---, wizards and the --- on behalf of the living
- 23.23 According to Isaiah's prophesy, the future would bring honour to Judah and those who walked in the --- would ---
- 23.24 Isaiah prophesied that a child will be born in the line of --- who will be called "Wonderful Counselor", "Prince of Peace"
- 23.25 Isaiah predicted the period in Judah when wolves and --- will live together in peace
- 23.26 In the future of Judah, Isaiah saw a time when nothing evil or harmful will exist and the earth will be --- of the knowledge of ---
- 23.27 The nations which Isaiah predicted their destruction by God were ---, --- and ---
- 23.28 Isaiah described the punishment and destruction of Moab, ---, Ethiopia, Egypt and prophesied about the time when God will receive offerings from --- and an altar will be built for Him in ---
- 23.29 According to Isaiah, in Egypt of the future, one of the 5 cities where Hebrew language will be spoken is the "City of the ---"
- 23.30 Prophet Isaiah was to demonstrate the sign of what will happen to Egypt and Ethiopia by going --- and ---for 3 years
- 23.31 When the sovereign Lord destroys --- forever, He will wipe away tears from every eye
- 23.32 Isaiah observed that the priests and prophets of Judah were so --- that they did not understand the --- God sent to them
- 23.33 On the day the forts of Israel's enemies are captured, the moon will be as bright as the --- and the sun will be --- times brighter
- 23.34 In the city with the highway called "The road of ---", there will be no sinners
- 23.35 Isaiah told king --- about the time in the future when everything in the palace will be carried off to Babylon but the king considered it a good message because there will be --- in his own time
- 23.36 A word of hope from God, "--- my people" and the announcement "Prepare a --- for the Lord" are preparations for the restoration of God's people to Himself
- 23.37 According to Isaiah, God appointed king --- to help Israel
- 23.38 --- promised all on earth that if they turned to Him and repented of their sins, they would have ---.
- 23.39 God has declared that unto Him every --- shall bow and every tongue shall ---
- 23.40 From our birth to --, god has promised to carry us unlike manmade gods which have to be carried.
- 23.41 Through prophet Isaiah, God described Israel as being obstinate, with an --- neck and a brass brow
- 23.42 God showed --- new things, even hidden things, but she did not understand them
- 23.43 The Lord told Isaiah that the --- of Israel will be despised but kings and princes shall worship him

- 23.44 The heavens shall vanish (pass away) like --- and the earth will become old like a --- but the Lord's salvation is forever
- 23.45 How beautiful upon the --- are the feet of those who bring good ---
- 23.46 Isaiah described the saviour as one rejected by man, a man of --- who will endure suffering and pain because of our ---
- 23.47 By the saviour's --- were are healed
- 23.48 According to Isaiah, the Lord's great invitation to everyone who thirsts is to buy drinks and even eat without --- and without ---
- 23.49 Isaiah encourages all to seek (turn to) --- while he may be found and to call on Him while He is ---
- 23.50 The lord has said that His thoughts are not --- neither are His ways ---
- 23.51 God's thoughts are higher than ours just as the --- are higher than the ---
- 23.52 God's word when it goes out of the mouth does not return without --- what it has been sent for, but it --- the one to whom it is sent
- 23.53 The right fast is not to punish the body but to let the oppressed go ---, feed the --- and accommodate the poor
- 23.54 Righteousness is described as a --- and salvation as a ---
- 23.55 For the future glory of Jerusalem, Isaiah proclaimed "Arise, shine, for your --- has come and the --- of the Lord has risen upon you"
- 23.56 Concerning the Good News of the Deliverer, Isaiah wrote "The --- of the Lord is upon me, because He has --- me to preach good tidings"
- 23.57 About those who are restored to the Lord, Isaiah proclaimed that they are a --- of glory to the Lord and a royal --- in God's hand
- 23.58 In Isaiah's prayer to the Lord for mercy on His people, he describes human beings as --- while God is the potter
- 23.59 When God creates the new heavens and new earth, a one hundred years old person will be called a ---
- 23.60 The Lord, through Isaiah said a time will come when He will answer before people --- and hear while they are still ---



24 **JEREMIAH**

- 24.1 The word of God was received by prophet Jeremiah during the reign of king ---, Jehoiakim and ---
- 24.2 Jeremiah's father was called ---
- 24.3 Jeremiah wanted to refuse his call as a prophet, claiming that he could not --- and he was a ---
- 24.4 To put His words in the mouth of prophet Jeremiah, God touched his ---
- 24.5 God described Israel as being ---, a --- vine which turned into a strange vine
- 24.6 Instead of returning to God, Israel behaved like a --- with many lovers
- 24.7 Jeremiah prophesied that a time will come when Jerusalem will be called the --- of the Lord
- 24.8 God said He will pardon --- if He could find in her one just man who seeks the ---
- 24.9 Jeremiah predicted the invasion of Jerusalem (Israel) by a mighty nation with a strange ---
- 24.10 In the terrible days of Judah, the high places of Topheth and the valley of --- where people sacrificed their --- will be so full of slaughtered people that there will be no place left
- 24.11 When God punished Israel, wives would be given to ---, there would be no grapes or --- and all the things God had give Israel would --- away from them
- 24.12 The punishment God asked Jeremiah to prophesy on Israel and Judah was that their sons will die by the --- and their daughters by ---
- 24.13 When Jeremiah prayed, God assured him that after punishment of Judah He will have --- and bring them back to their ---
- 24.14 God demonstrated the way the pride of Judah and Jerusalem will be destroyed using a --- which he instructed Jeremiah to hide in a hole of a ---
- 24.15 God told Jeremiah that the --- of man is deceitful above all things and desperately wicked

- 24.16 Pashur, son of --- the priest slapped Jeremiah when he heard the prophecies concerning Judah and Jerusalem
- 24.17 Like Job, when Jeremiah was afflicted and mocked, he wished he had never been --- or had died at birth and he cursed the day of his ---
- 24.18 Jeremiah predicted the captivity of king --- and his people by king Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon
- 24.19 Jeremiah prophesied that Judah and Israel will be saved by a branch of David whose name would be “---“
- 24.20 When Jeremiah was arrested because of his prophecies and the people wanted him killed, he was spared because the --- said he had spoken in the name of ---
- 24.21 --- prophesied that the Lord had broken the yoke of Babylon, contrary to Jeremiah’s prophecies
- 24.22 When Hananiah broke the yoke around Jeremiah’s neck as a demonstration of the breaking of ---’s yoke, the Lord said he had broken the yoke of --- and replaced it with a yoke of ---
- 24.23 Prophet --- died the same year that he prophesied falsely
- 24.24 Prophet Jeremiah wrote to the elders and priests in exile in Babylon that the exile will last --- years
- 24.25 Jeremiah bought a --- from his nephew while he was still in prison
- 24.26 Jeremiah gave the evidence (deed) of a purchase from his nephew to ---
- 24.27 Jeremiah wanted the sealed deed of and an open copy to be put in a --- jar to preserve them for many years.
- 24.28 In relation to the property he purchased, Jeremiah prophesied that houses, fields and vineyards will again be bought in ---
- 24.29 When Jeremiah prayed and pleaded for God’s mercy on Jerusalem, God said it will be destroyed by the --- because the people of Judah had made Him angry from the day the city was built and they even put --- in His own temple
- 24.30 The Lord accused the people of Judah of sacrificing their sons and daughters to the god ---
- 24.31 God told Jeremiah that when Judah was restored, He will be the people’s --- and they will have one purpose in life, which will be to --- Him for their own good and for the good of their ---
- 24.32 In His promise of hope for the people of Judah, the Lord said He would never break the covenant that --- would always have a descendant to be king
- 24.33 As the Babylonians attacked Jerusalem, they also attacked --- and ---, the only fortified cities left in Judah
- 24.34 When the people of Judah changed their minds instead of freeing their Hebrew slaves, God in His anger said He will give them (Judah) the freedom to die by ---, ---, and ---
- 24.35 Jeremiah took the entire Rechabite clan ---, the son of another Jeremiah and all his brothers and sons and offered them --- which they refused to take
- 24.36 God compared the obedience of the Rechabites to their ancestor --- with the disobedience of ---
- 24.37 As a reward for their obedience, God promised that ---, son of Rechab will always have a male descendant to ---

- 24.38 When God asked Jeremiah to record all that He had revealed to him about Judah and Israel, he dictated it to ---
- 24.39 Jeremiah instructed his scribe to go to the temple when the people were --- and to read the message he had written to them
- 24.40 Baruch read from the scroll on which he wrote God's message through --- to the people in the temple from the room of ---
- 24.41 --- went to tell the officials about what he heard Baruch reading out to the people
- 24.42 When Baruch read the message out to the officials, they alarmed and advised Baruch and Jeremiah to go and ---
- 24.43 As --- was reading the scroll, the king kept throwing portions read into a ---
- 24.44 The Lord instructed Jeremiah to write his message on another scroll and this time to let the king know that his corpse will be thrown where it will be exposed to --- by day and --- by night
- 24.45 When Jeremiah tried to go to the land of --- to take possession of his share of the family property, he was accused by --- of deserting to the Babylonians (Chaldeans)
- 24.46 Jeremiah was kept in the underground (dungeon) cell of the house of --- which had been turned into a prison
- 24.47 Jeremiah was sure that he would die if sent back to the prison where he was kept earlier, so the king ordered him to be locked up in the ---
- 24.48 King Zedekiah's officials were worried that their soldiers would lose courage because Jeremiah was telling the people to ---
- 24.49 Jeremiah was put in the well of --- which contained only ---
- 24.50 ---, a eunuch and three men pulled Jeremiah out of a well
- 24.51 In order for Jeremiah not to be hurt by the ropes used for pulling him out of a well he was given --- to put under his armpit
- 24.52 Jeremiah was kept in the palace courtyard until the day Jerusalem was captured because he --- to the officials as the king had advised secretly
- 24.53 Nebuchadnezzar started attacking Jerusalem in the -- year of Zedekiah's reign but did not break through the walls until the -- year
- 24.54 --- released Jeremiah and gave him the privilege to choose between staying in Jerusalem or going to ---
- 24.55 The commander of the Babylonian imperial guard promised to look after --- if he followed him to Babylon
- 24.56 Jeremiah went to --- and stayed with him at --- along with those left in Jerusalem
- 24.57 Even though warned by --- of Ishmael's plans to kill him, Gedaliah did not believe but while --- together, he was killed by --- and his colleagues
- 24.58 --- pretended by weeping as he met the eighty men from Shechem, Siloh and Samaria who brought grain offerings to the Temple and he slaughtered them all
- 24.59 --- rescued all the king's daughters and others whom Ishmael took captive
- 24.60 Jonathan and the survivors from Mizpah stopped at --- near Bethlehem on their way to Egypt
- 24.61 The Lord answered Jeremiah's prayer saying that He --- over the disaster He brought on Jerusalem but He was going to deliver the remnant from --- and restore them to their land
- 24.62 The Lord told Jeremiah that the remnant of Judah would die if it went to ---
- 24.63 The remnant of Judah disobeyed and went to --- in Egypt

- 24.64 The Lord instructed Jeremiah to illustrate how Nebuchadnezzar would come and capture Egypt by burying large --- in the brick pavement of Pharaoh's palace
- 24.65 The remnant of Judah in Egypt, rather than heed the warnings of Jeremiah decided they would burn incense to the ---
- 24.66 At the time the remnant of Judah went to live in Egypt, Pharaoh --- was king
- 24.67 The Lord sent a message to Baruch, through Jeremiah, assuring him of --- anytime he brought disaster on all people
- 24.68 Jeremiah prophesied about the disaster of Philistine before --- attacked Gaza
- 24.69 God's judgement on Moab was --- but He promised to restore Moab's fortune in the future
- 24.70 Babylon was a --- cup in the Lord's hand and she made the nations ---, therefore, the Lord declared that at the sound of Babylon's capture, the earth would ---



25 **LAMENTATIONS**

- 25.1 In the book of Lamentations, prophet ---- described Jerusalem as a --- crying bitterly at night
- 25.2 In their sorrow, the people of --- realized that --- was in the right and admitted that they had been rebellious
- 25.3 In Lamentations, God in his ---- is said to have put the daughter of Zion under a cloud and did not remember his ---
- 25.4 In sorrow, the elders of the daughter of Zion sat on the ground, put --- on their heads and wore ---
- 25.5 In his sorrow, Jeremiah still said “the steadfast --- of the Lord never ceases, His --- never come to an end”
- 25.6 Jeremiah’s soul said “ the Lord is my ---, therefore I will hope in Him”
- 25.7 In exile, it seemed to jeremiah that the victims of the sword were happier than the victims of ---
- 25.8 Jeremiah felt that the exiles were suffering for the sins committed by ----
- 25.9 In exile, young men were compelled to ---- and boys suffer under the loads of ---
- 25.10 Jeremiah prayed to the Lord that they may be --- to Him



26 ***EZEKIEL***

- 26.1 In the --- year of the exile in --- (land of the Chaldeans), prophet Ezekiel saw a vision
- 26.2 Ezekiel's father was called ---
- 26.3 In his vision, Ezekiel saw four men in a storm each having --- faces and --- wings
- 26.4 In his vision Ezekiel also saw wheels within --- going in --- directions without turning
- 26.5 The wheels in Ezekiel's vision had spokes and --- full of ---
- 26.6 Ezekiel was instructed by the Lord in his vision to --- the scroll and then go and proclaim its content to the people of Israel.
- 26.7 Ezekiel likened the scroll to ----
- 26.8 The Lord told Ezekiel that if he did not warn a wicked man to turn from his sins and the man dies, the man's --- will be required at Ezekiel's ----
- 26.9 The lord told Ezekiel to lie upon his --- side for the number of days representing the number of --- of the punishment of Israel
- 26.10 Ezekiel was instructed to lie on his --- side for --- days representing the number of years of the punishment of Judah
- 26.11 Ezekiel was to shave his head and beard in --- portions and what he was instructed to do with each portion represented what would happen to the house of ---
- 26.12 In his second vision, Ezekiel was lifted by a --- and taken to --- where he saw the glory of the Lord as he had seen in the first vision
- 26.13 The Lord was angry with the people of Jerusalem because of abominations like the worship of --- and the sun
- 26.14 The only people to be spared of the sword in Jerusalem were those who had a mark on their --- because they sighed and groaned over the abominations
- 26.15 The whirling wheels in Ezekiel's vision had four faces each which looked like the faces of a cherub, a ----, a lion and an ----
- 26.16 Ezekiel was instructed to prophesy against princes who misled the people including Pelatiah and ---.

- 26.17 While Ezekiel was still prophesying, Pelatiah the son of --- fell and died
- 26.18 A proverb concerning the land of Israel says “ the --- have eaten the sour grapes, and the children’s --- are set on edge”
- 26.19 The Lord, the highest judge says “ it is the soul that sins that shall ---”. The Lord will not punish anyone for the sins of another.
- 26.20 The word of the Lord came to Ezekiel describing two sisters, Oholah which was Samaria and ---, Jerusalem which was more ---.
- 26.21 Jerusalem, because of its idolatory and abominations was likened in a parable by God to a --- bronze cooking pot
- 26.22 Concerning Tyre, the Lord said it will be so destroyed that even her soil will be removed, leaving her as a bare ---
- 26.23 The Lord accused the ruler of Tyre of claiming to be a --- and better than ---
- 26.24 The punishment for the proud ruler of Tyre --- was that he would be killed and his grave would be in the ---
- 26.25 The prophesy concerning the city of Sidon was that God was its ---
- 26.26 In the prophesy against king ---, God described him as a monster crocodile (great dragon in the midst of streams)
- 26.27 In Ezekiel’s vision, Egypt is compared with a tall, beautiful, well watered --- tree
- 26.28 God appointed prophet Ezekiel as a --- over Israel
- 26.29 In visions, ---- was called “son of man” or “mortal man”
- 26.30 God described Himself as “the good ---“ of the people of Israel
- 26.31 In one of his visions, the spirit took prophet Ezekiel was taken to a valley full of dry ---- and asked if they could come back to life
- 26.32 The Lord told prophet Ezekiel that the person he loved most would die and his --- died
- 26.33 Ezekiel was instructed not to ---- for his loved one as a sign to Israelites who must not mourn for their beloved ones God was going to kill
- 26.34 As prophet Ezekiel to prophesied to dry bones, they became human beings again but had no --- in them
- 26.35 Using two --- as symbols, the Lord assured Ezekiel that he will bring Israel and Judah together under one ruler
- 26.36 Ezekiel prophesied that Gog, the ruler in the land of --- will invade a helpless country --- where people live in peace and security
- 26.37 After his death, Gog was to be buried in Israel in the valley of ---
- 26.38 When the spirit took Ezekiel to Jerusalem, he saw a man standing in the gateway to the temple holding two articles used for ---
- 26.39 The vision of the presence of the Lord which Ezekiel saw in the new Jerusalem temple was like the one he saw by river ---
- 26.40 The Lord called the temple in Ezekiel’s vision his ---
- 26.41 The Law of the Temple is that all the area surrounding it on the top of the mountain is ---
- 26.42 The gate on the --- side of the temple in Ezekiel’s vision was never to be used by human beings
- 26.43 One of the rules of the temple is that no foreigner, or one who disobeys the lord or is not --- may enter the temple

- 26.44 The punishment for Levites was that they will do menial jobs in the temple but not serve as --- or enter the ---
- 26.45 Only Levites descended from the tribe of --- were to serve in the new temple in Ezekiel's vision of the new Jerusalem
- 26.46 When the land of Israel was to be divided, a portion was to be for the Lord and part of this portion was where the --- were to have their houses
- 26.47 One of the regulations for worship in the new temple in Jerusalem was that every Sabbath and every --- festival, all the people must worship in front of the --- gate
- 26.48 The stream which flowed from the new temple in Jerusalem was to make the water of the --- fresh
- 26.49 The trees watered by the river from the sanctuary will bear fruit every --- and their leaves which will be for --- will not wither
- 26.50 The name of the new city which prophet Ezekiel was shown in his dream was to be called ---



27 DANIEL

- 27.1 The chief of the court officials in Babylon, --- was ordered to bring into the palace young, handsome, intelligent men to serve in the palace.
- 27.2 The young men to be brought to serve in the palace were to be those of ---- --- family and the ---
- 27.3 The king wanted the young men selected for service in the palace to be trained in Babylonian language and literature for --- years
- 27.4 The king assigned a daily amount of food and --- from his --- for the young men who would serve in his palace after training
- 27.5 Four of the men selected to be trained for service in the Babylonian palace were Daniel, Hananiah, --- and --- from Judah
- 27.6 The four young men from Judah were given new names and Daniel was called ---, Hananiah ----, Mishael --- and Azariah ---
- 27.7 Daniel did not want to --- himself with the food from the king
- 27.8 After a --- days trial on --- and ---, Daniel and his colleagues looked healthier than other young men who were eating the king's food
- 27.9 At the end of their training --- of the other young men were better than Daniel and his 3 colleagues
- 27.10 The four young men from Judah who served in the Babylonian king's palace were --- times better than the magicians and --- in the whole kingdom
- 27.11 King Nebuchadnezzar called for magicians, enchanters, astrologers and sorcerers to tell him what he --- and to interpret it
- 27.12 The wise men of Babylon were to be --- because they thought only --- could perform the task their king demanded
- 27.13 Daniel and his colleagues ---- so that they might know the answer to the king's mystery
- 27.14 God revealed Nebuchadnezzar's mystery to Daniel in a ---
- 27.15 In Nebuchadnezzar's dream, the enormous statue had a head of ---
- 27.16 In the dream of the king of Babylon, a stone was cut out but not with --- hands

- 27.17 When the stone in king Nebuchadnezzar's dream struck the statue, it was broken to pieces and blown off but the stone became a --- --- that filled the whole earth
- 27.18 The part of the statue in Babylonian king's dream which represented him was the ---
- 27.19 The statue in Nebuchadnezzar's dream represented --- kingdoms
- 27.20 When Daniel finished interpreting the dream, king Nebuchadnezzar in all his majesty fell --- before him
- 27.21 Nebuchadnezzar acknowledged Daniel's god as the "--- of ---"
- 27.22 At ---'s request, Shadrach, Meshach and Abenego were made --- over the province of Babylon while he was ruler of the entire province
- 27.23 The gold image made by king Nebuchadnezzar was --- feet high and --- feet wide
- 27.24 King Nebuchadnezzar proclaimed that anyone who did not fall down and worship the image he set up at the sound of musical instruments will be thrown into a ---
- 27.25 Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego refused to worship the image and had faith that the --- whom they --- would save them
- 27.26 Nebuchadnezzar was so angry that anyone would refuse to worship the image he set up that he ordered the furnace to be heated up --- times more than before
- 27.27 The three Jews who refused to worship the image set up by the Babylonian king were bound with their --- on and thrown into the ---
- 27.28 Even though the furnace burned the soldiers who went near the furnace, the men who were thrown in --- around in it
- 27.29 Instead of three men thrown into the furnace, the king saw --- and said one of them looked like a ---
- 27.30 In Nebuchadnezzar's dream of a tree, only the --- and --- remained in the ground bound with iron and bronze after it was cut down.
- 27.31 The declaration of the holy ones in Nebuchadnezzar's dream was "the most high is --- over the kingdoms of men and gives them to anyone he wishes and sets over them the --- of men"
- 27.32 Daniel's interpretation was that until Nebuchadnezzar acknowledged that --- rules, he will be driven from people, live with --- and eat ---
- 27.33 King Nebuchadnezzar did not heed --- advice that he should repent of his sins and stop oppressing the poor, and --- months later, the dream was fulfilled
- 27.34 When --- times had passed as predicted in his dream, Nebuchadnezzar's sanity returned as he acknowledge God as sovereign
- 27.35 Nebuchadnezzar's son who ruled after him was ---
- 27.36 Belshazzar, his officials, wives and concubines were drinking from the gold goblets taken from the --- in ---
- 27.37 When the human --- wrote on the wall, Belshazzar was so afraid that he turned --- and his --- gave way
- 27.38 Even though Belshazzar promised a --- robe, gold chain and installation as the --- highest ruler in Babylon to anyone who could interpret the handwriting on the wall, Daniel refused the gifts
- 27.39 The inscription on the wall which Belshazzar wanted interpreted was "MENE, ---, ---, PARSIN (PERES)"
- 27.40 In the handwriting on the wall before Belshazzar ---- means "God has numbered the days of your reign and brought it to an end"

- 27.41 PARSIN (PERES) in the handwriting on the wall was interpreted by Daniel to mean “ your kingdom is divided and given to the --- and ---“
- 27.42 The very night of the day that Belshazzar dishonoured God by drinking from the temple goblets, he was --- and Darius the --- became king
- 27.43 Jealous of Daniel, other administrators went to king --- and urged him to proclaim a decree that no one in Babylon must worship any god but himself
- 27.44 Even after hearing of the king’s decree, Daniel continued to pray --- times daily by his window which faced ---
- 27.45 Daniel was thrown into a ---- because he continued to pray to God and not man
- 27.46 King Darius thought Daniel would be killed but he was not hurt because --- sent - -- to protect him
- 27.47 Daniel prospered during the reign of Darius the --- and Cyrus the --- , the two kings predicted to take over from Belshazzar
- 27.48 Daniel wrote down his dream of --- winds of heaven churning up the sea and four different --- coming out of the sea
- 27.49 In Daniel’s dream, a --- had the wings of an eagle, a bear had three --- in its mouth, between its teeth
- 27.50 The beast with --- horns and a horn that had eyes and which was boastful, was killed and thrown into --- in Daniel’s dream
- 27.51 The meaning of Daniel’s dream was four kingdoms that would rise from the --- but the saints of the --- would receive the kingdom and possess it forever
- 27.52 In Daniel’s vision of the ram and the goat, --- was asked to give him the interpretation which concerned the time of the ---
- 27.53 Daniel prayed for God’s mercy on the people of Israel and restoration of --- and Gabriel told him that seventy --- (70x--- years) were decreed for the people and the city to finish transgressions and put an end to sin
- 27.54 Daniel was told in a vision that his prayers had been answered but the prince of --- prevented the angelic being from reaching him until --- came to his aid
- 27.55 Daniel was told in visions that he was highly ---
- 27.56 In the time of distress, multitudes who have already died will awake, some to --- --- and others to shame and everlasting contempt (disgrace)
- 27.57 Those who lead others into righteousness will shine like --- for ---
- 27.58 Daniel was told to close up and --- the words of the scroll until the time of ---
- 27.59 Daniel heard many things in his vision but he did not ----
- 27.60 Daniel was advised to be faithful to the end when he will receive his ---



28 HOSEA

- 28.1 The Word of the Lord came to Hosea, son of --- during the reigns of --- kings of Judah and --- king of Israel
- 28.2 The kings of Judah who reigned in the time of Hosea's writing were Uzziah, Jotham, --- and ---
- 28.3 God instructed prophet Hosea to marry a wife who was --- in character
- 28.4 Prophet Hosea married --- daughter of ---
- 28.5 The first son and first daughter of Hosea were named --- and ---
- 28.6 God said that he would not show love to the people of --- but will show love to the house of ---
- 28.7 Hosea's third child was named Lo-Ammi because God said the people of --- were not his people and he was not their God
- 28.8 The day that the adulterous woman in Hosea's description is taken back to her vineyard, she will --- like in her old days
- 28.9 --- told prophet Hosea to go and show that he loves his wife the way that he loves ---
- 28.10 Hosea had to buy back his wife who was to live with her husband without other lovers just as Israel will be without a ---
- 28.11 God said when he found Israel, it was like finding --- in the desert
- 28.12 God was angry with Israel because instead of calling on him in their distress, they --- on their beds
- 28.13 When the hilltop shrines where Israel worshipped idols are destroyed, the people will say to the mountains "--- ---" and to the hills "--- --- ---"
- 28.14 When Israel was a child, God called him his ---
- 28.15 God said that because the people of Israel refused to return to him, they must return to ---
- 28.16 One of god's accusations against Israel was that when they were hungry he fed them and when they were satisfied, they became ---
- 28.17 God promised to ransom Ephraim from the power of the ---

- 28.18 When God decides to have mercy on Israel, he will be like a --- and Israel will blossom like a ---
- 28.19 When Israel returns to the Lord, his fragrance will be like the --- of Lebanon
- 28.20 The ways of the Lord are right; the righteous walk in them but the rebellious --- in them



29 *JOEL*

- 29.1 Prophet Joel's father was ---
- 29.2 The locusts in Joel's vision were powerful and had teeth like those of a ---
- 29.3 ---- of locusts, one after the other devoured the crops until there was no corn or --- to offer at the temple
- 29.4 Joel suggested the declaration of a holy --- and prayers in the temple
- 29.5 Prophet Joel warned the people of --- that the day of the --- was coming soon
- 29.6 Joel called for sincere repentance from the heart, not mere tearing of ---
- 29.7 When God restores the ---, the people will know that God is among them and they will not be despised again
- 29.8 When God pours out his spirit on --- in Israel, their --- and --- will proclaim God's message
- 29.9 When the spirit is on the old, they will have --- and when on the young ones, they will see ---
- 29.10 On the day of the Lord, the sun will be --- and the moon will turn --- as ---



30 AMOS

- 30.1 Prophet Amos was a --- from the town of ---
- 30.2 Amos had visions about Israel during the reign of --- of Judah and --- of Israel
- 30.3 Amos warns of God's judgement on Jerusalem which will lead to the drying up of ---
- 30.4 Amos also warns of God's judgement on Israel's neighbours, Damascus in ---, Gaza in ----, Tyre and ---, ---, --- and Judah
- 30.5 Among the sins of Israel are that they made the --- drink wine and prevented the prophets from ---
- 30.6 Prophet Amos was instructed to announce to Egypt and Ashdod the disaster that will befall ---
- 30.7 The women of Samaria who oppressed the poor and drank liquor are described as ---
- 30.8 Amos describes the day of the Lord for unrepentant people as a day of ---
- 30.9 God rejects the offerings and sacrifices of disobedient people but wants --- to flow like a river
- 30.10 Like prophet Joel, Amos saw a vision of --- which destroyed everything on the land
- 30.11 The Lord changed his mind about the destruction of Israel by --- and ---
- 30.12 In the vision of a plumb line, God told Amos that he would set a --- among the people of Israel
- 30.13 The priest of Bethel, --- opposed the prophecies of Amos
- 30.14 God's punishment for the priest of Bethel who opposed Amos was that his wife would turn into a ---
- 30.15 The vision of a basket of ripe --- was God's way of showing Amos that the time was ripe for Israel to be punished
- 30.16 God told Amos that the famine he will send through the land will not be a famine of food or water but a famine for ---
- 30.17 God declared that the people of Cush (Ethiopia) are the same to him as the people of ---
- 30.18 God promised to restore the house of --- and all the nations that were once his will be conquered
- 30.19 When the Lord restores Israel, --- will grow faster than it can be harvested

30.20 God promised to bring the people of Israel back to their --- and they will rebuild their ---



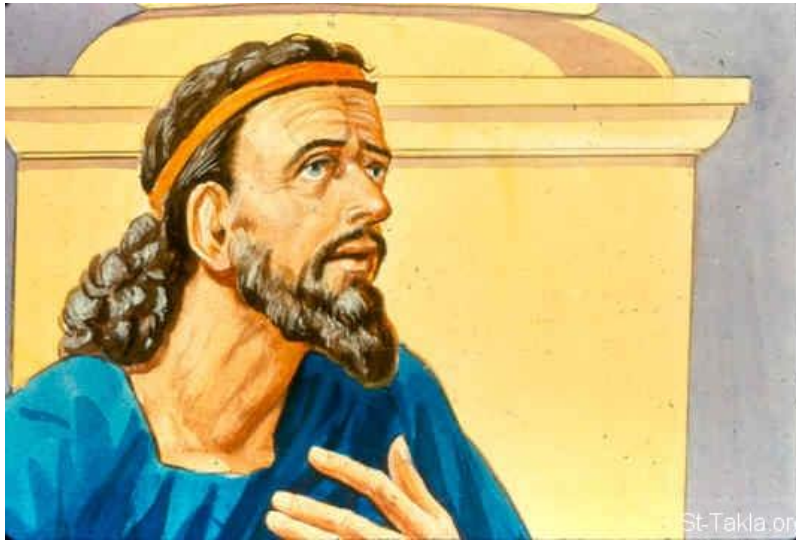
31 *O*BADIAH

- 31.1 Obadiah prophesied about God's punishment for Edomites, the descendants of ---
- 31.2 The reason for Edom's punishment was the part it played in robbing and --- the Israelites, the descendants of Esau's brother ---
- 31.3 When Judah was attacked, the Edomites captured those who tried to --- and handed them over to ----
- 31.4 Obadiah prophesied that when Israelites eventually strike back, --- of the descendants of Esau will survive
- 31.5 When the men of Jerusalem capture Edom and rule over the land --- will be the king



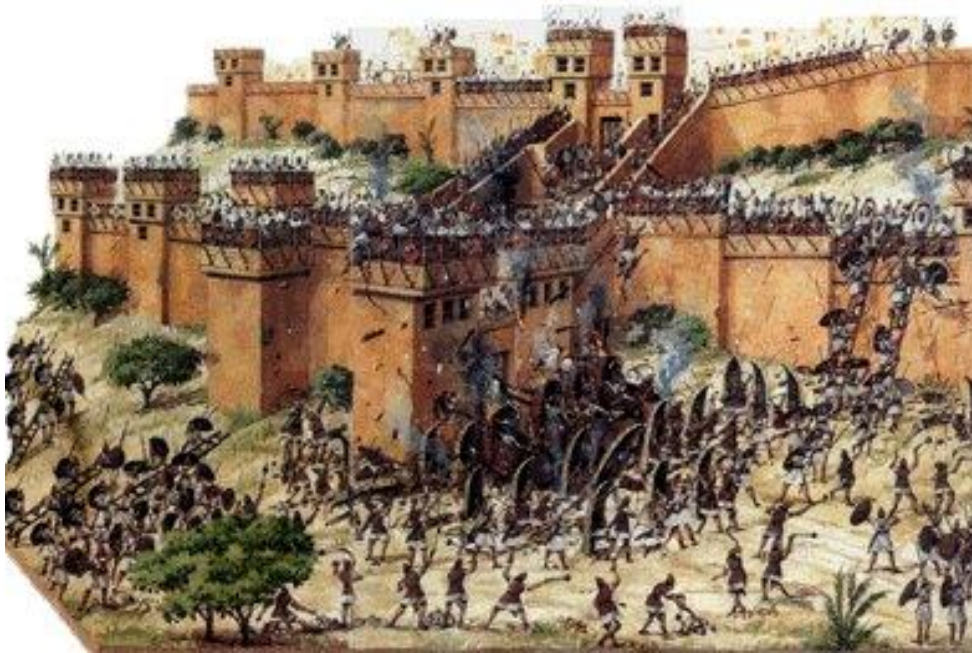
32 *JONAH*

- 32.1 God told Jonah, son of --- to go and speak against the city of ---
- 32.2 Instead of going where God sent him, Jonah headed for ----
- 32.3 When the ship that Jonah boarded in --- was almost breaking up because of a ---, the sailors threw their --- overboard
- 32.4 While the sailors were terrified and calling out to their gods, Jonah was asleep below the --- of the ship
- 32.5 The sailors decided to --- to determine who was responsible for the danger they were in and it was ---
- 32.6 Jonah told the sailors that he was running away from---
- 32.7 The sailors did not want to throw Jonah overboard as --- suggested but the storm grew worse and they had to
- 32.8 The sea --- when Jonah was thrown overboard, making the sailors afraid of ---
- 32.9 Jonah was in the belly of the --- that swallowed him for --- days and --- nights
- 32.10 When Jonah ---, God answered and he was deposited on ----
- 32.11 Nineveh was so large a city it took --- to walk through it
- 32.12 Jonah proclaimed God's message saying " in --- days, Nineveh will be destroyed"
- 32.13 God had compassion on the people of Nineveh because --- and their --- fasted and turned away from their evil ways
- 32.14 Jonah was angry because Nineveh was spared and asked God to take away his ---
- 32.15 As Jonah waited to see what would happen to Nineveh God provided a --- to give him shade
- 32.16 Jonah told God he was angry enough to --- because a --- made the plant that gave him shade wither
- 32.17 Nineveh had a population of more than ----
- 32.18 Jonah was more concerned about --- than about ---
- 32.19 The decree of the king of Nineveh affected even all animals which were also to be covered in --- and were not allowed to eat or drink
- 32.20 The shade which God provided for Jonah grew overnight and withered ---



33 *MICAH*

- 33.1 Micah was from the town of --- in ---
- 33.2 The kings who reigned during the period of Micah's vision were Jotham, --- and ---
- 33.3 Micah's vision concerned the cities of --- and ---
- 33.4 Micah said he will mourn for the doomed cities by going about --- and ---
- 33.5 When the enemy strikes, Micah predicted that the leaders (glory of) of Israel will go and --- in the caves of ---
- 33.6 The --- did not want Micah to prophesy
- 33.7 There is hope for the people as God promised that --- will lead them out of exile
- 33.8 The people who --- the prophets were being deceived that there will be peace
- 33.9 Micah accused the people of building God's city on --- and ---
- 33.10 Micah predicted a future when many --- will go to Israel's temple for God
- 33.11 In Micah's prophesy, God promised a ruler who will come from --- one of the smallest cities of Judah
- 33.12 The greatness of the ruler from --- will be acknowledged over all the earth and he will bring ---
- 33.13 What God requires of us is to act ---, love mercy and walk --- with our God
- 33.14 Micah predicted that the people of Jerusalem will return from everywhere but the earth will become ---
- 33.15 Micah described the Lord as God who does not stay -- for ever but delights in showing ---



34 *NAHUM*

- 34.1 Nahum who was from --- saw visions about ---
34.2 Nahum described the clouds as the --- of God's feet
34.3 The fall of Nineveh was linked by Nahum to the restoration of the glory of

34.4 The merchants of Nineveh numbered more than ----
34.5 The merchants of Nineveh will strip it like --- strip the land



35 **HABAKKUK**

- 35.1 Habakkuk's first complaint to --- was about the violence and injustice
- 35.2 God told Habakkuk that the --- army will conquer the nations
- 35.3 The horses of the --- army are faster than leopards and fiercer than hungry ---
- 35.4 The strength of the Babylonian army is in their ---
- 35.5 Habakkuk's second complaint concerns God watching as an evil nation destroys those who are ---
- 35.6 God assured Habakkuk that those who are evil will not --- while those who are righteous will live by their ---
- 35.7 In the Lord's answer to Habakkuk, he said idols are useless and have no --- but the Lord is in his Temple, let --- keep silent before him
- 35.8 God told Habakkuk that the earth will be full of the knowledge of the glory of God as the --- covers the ---
- 35.9 Habakkuk prayed and described the awesome attributes of God whose time of punishment of those who attacked --- he was waiting for
- 35.10 Habakkuk claimed that even if the fig trees have no fruit, and there are no grapes on ---, the fields produce no --- and there are no sheep or cattle, he will --- in the Lord



36 **ZEPHANIAH**

- 36.1 The message of the Lord came to Zephaniah during the reign of --- king of Judah
- 36.2 Zephaniah was a descendant of king ---- of Judah
- 36.3 Zephaniah prophesied that God was going to --- everything on the earth
- 36.4 Zephaniah prophesied that on the Day of the Lord, --- will be heard from the Fish gate of Jerusalem
- 36.5 God will punish those who said God will not do --- or ---
- 36.6 In Zephaniah's prophesy God will destroy the whole earth with the --- of his fury
- 36.7 --- pleaded with the people to repent and --- themselves
- 36.8 When the Lord has destroyed Israel's neighbouring nations, --- will occupy their lands
- 36.9 When the Lord starts destruction, everyone who passes by will hiss and shrink at the horror of the ruins of ---
- 36.10 Zephaniah described the officials of Jerusalem as --- and the judges as ---



37 *HAGGAI*

- 37.1 The Lord spoke to Haggai in the --- year of the reign of Darius, emperor of ---
- 37.2 The message of Haggai was for the governor of Judah --- son of ---
- 37.3 In Haggai's message, God accused the people of living in well-built houses while the --- was in ruins
- 37.4 Zerubbabel and --- the high priest and the people who returned from--- worked on the Temple
- 37.5 The Lord said that everything the people offered at the altar was ---
- 37.6 From the day the --- of the temple was rebuilt, God promised to --- the people
- 37.7 God gave Haggai a second message which was for ----
- 37.8 God said he would shake the --- and the ---
- 37.9 God was about to --- the kingdoms of the earth
- 37.10 God called Zerubbabel His --- and was going to make him a ---- to rule in His name



38 ZECHARIAH

- 38.1 The Lord gave Zechariah messages during the reign of king ---
- 38.2 Zechariah's father was ----, the son of ---
- 38.3 In the message given to Zechariah, God urged the people to --- to him
- 38.4 In a vision, Zechariah saw a man riding a --- horse
- 38.5 Horses of ----, ---- and ---- colours were sent to --- the earth
- 38.6 In his vision --- reported that they found the earth at rest (helpless and subdued)
- 38.7 God assured Zechariah in his vision that --- will be restored
- 38.8 In another vision, Zechariah saw four --- representing the powers which scattered the people of Judah, --- and Jerusalem
- 38.9 In another vision, an angel said that --- will be too big to have a wall and God was going to be a wall of --- to it
- 38.10 Zechariah, in a vision saw --- standing before an angel and --- was there to accuse him
- 38.11 By taking away the filthy clothes Joshua had on in a vision, his --- was removed
- 38.12 The seven lamps in Zechariah's vision represented the seven --- of God
- 38.13 The message from --- to Zerubbabel was that he would be successful not by military might but by ---
- 38.14 On the sides of a flying scroll were written --- for those who --- or tell lies
- 38.15 In the vision of the basket, the woman represented ---
- 38.16 The basket in Zechariah's vision was flown to --- where it would be worshipped
- 38.17 Zechariah was instructed to make a --- from silver and --- to place on Joshua's head
- 38.18 A memorial was to be placed in the Temple in honour of Heldai, Tobijah, --- and ---
- 38.19 When the Lord restores Jerusalem, nations will no longer curse each other by the disasters of --- and --- but pray to receive their ----
- 38.20 The future king coming triumphant to Zion will be --- and ride on the ----
- 38.21 The future king will make --- among the nations and rule from --- to --- and to the ends of the ---
- 38.22 In the vision where Zechariah was a shepherd, he had two sticks named --- and ---

- 38.23 Zechariah as a shepherd was paid --- pieces of silver as his wage
- 38.24 In the days of restoration, God will pour on David's descendants the spirit of ---
and spirit of ---
- 38.25 Zechariah prophesied of the day the Lord will come with all the --- and He will be
king over ---



39 *MALACHI*

- 39.1 Malachi received a message from the Lord concerning His --- for Israel
- 39.2 The priests and people of Israel were guilty of dishonouring God through their --- and ---
- 39.3 God was not accepting the offerings of those who broke their promise to the --- of their youth
- 39.4 God wants men to be faithful to their wives because He hates ---
